Our professional book study with Zaretta brought together a cadre of people to read and discuss Culturally Responsive education work. AASB would like to continue to bring together folks who've had additional training and who have been doing work on cultural responsiveness, implicit bias, educational equity. We'd be contacted by a couple of our partners and will be doing some deeper culturally responsive integration work.

Zaretta describes this necessary and initial work as Year Zero, meaning that the classroom teachers and staff need cultural integration capacity building to build both the understanding and begin preparing so that the first year to bring into the classroom, they are ready with the foundational knowledge and support to make it work.
