Pulpits are essentially a medieval invention. Abbot Samson of Bury St. Edmunds had one made in the late twelfth century so that he could preach to the people in English, and thirteenth and fourteenth century examples still exist in Italy. In the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries it became fashionable in the Church of Scotland to make the pulpit the focal point of the interior, often placing it against the wall opposite the entrance.

The Revised Common Lectionary readings for the time after Pentecost cover large sections of the biblical story—major narratives of the Hebrew scriptures; the writings of the apostles to the earliest Christian communities; and the Gospel accounts of Jesus' ministry of teaching, healing, feeding, and welcoming.


