Our order of worship places Word and Sacrament at the center. Surrounding these two central actions are briefer rites for meeting and parting.

As the hymnal note tells, hymn 292 started with the tune. When the author was given the music, she reacted by saying, "its lyricism gave a feeling of the movement of the Spirit, both gentle and powerful."

The Litany will be read in a reflective manner by liturgists and the choir will provide Taizé' chant, "Veni Sancte Spiritus" (Come Holy Spirit), as background music. It comes from Wellsprings in England.
