Covenant (9:45 a.m. Congregation House) February 4, 11, 18, 25.

Professor of Sociology Matt Samson will present a four-week class on "Creation, Cosmology, and Climate Justice: A view from the Global South." This unit places the idea of "integral ecology" from Pope Francis's encyclical *Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home* in conversation with recent Reformed ideas on the doctrine of creation. Climate justice is then considered from the perspective of activist movements in the Global South (primarily Latin America) that challenge the unjust distribution of the costs of extractive economic activities such as mining and plantation agriculture. Case studies from the Presbyterian Hunger Program of the PCUSA in Peru and Bolivia will be used to facilitate our discussion.


