MS Matters at Home: Empowering Your Child to Stand Up for Themselves

In a recent blog post, *Screenwise* author (and Salisbury Academy guest speaker on Feb. 8) Devorah Heitner recommends the following tips for teaching your child to be a good citizen online:

1. Arm your child with statements that they can use with friends to help them stand on their own.

- a. "Please don't text me after 9 pm or I'll get in trouble."
- b. "I have to set my status to do not disturb while I'm doing my homework, so you won't see me in the group text/game/ on Snapchat, etc."

c. "Dude, that's not even funny."2. Help them to set up boundaries with their friends on social media.
