5/21 BUILDING ON...RELATIONSHIPS

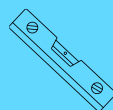
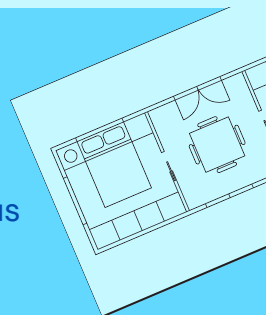

11/9 BUILDING ON...TRANSITIONS

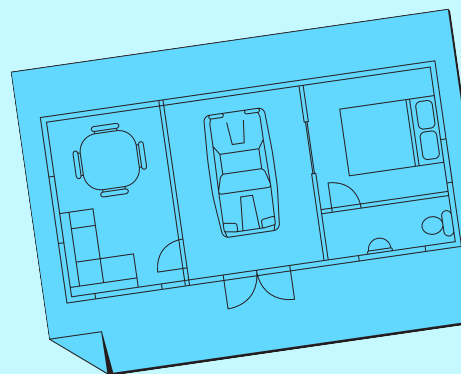

GRANTS & TRAINING FOR ELDERS

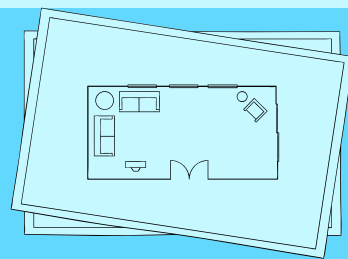


- CCV awarded Vitality Grants to 6 congregations

- CPM and CCV sponsored Boundary Awareness Training for deacons, ruling elders, and clergy led by LeaderWise.



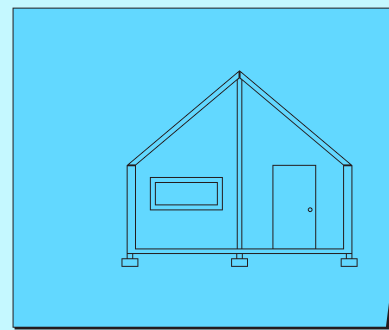
227TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY IN 2026

Milwaukee was chosen to host the next General Assembly! Our Committee on Local Arrangements has been formed and met with representatives from the General Assembly in November.



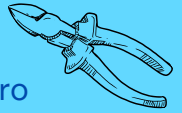
TRANSITION TEAM
