We are a community of memory and hope, living out of our tradition and living into a vision of God's purposes. As believers who share a common faith in God as known in Jesus Christ, we welcome diversity as a sign of God's varied grace among us.

We welcome the pluralism and ambiguities of urban life as the context given by God to love our neighbors and manifest the Gospel.

We affirm that the church does not live for itself; we are to be an instrument of grace, wisdom, and compassion and a witness to God's activity in our midst.

We shall marshal and manage our re-sources to be effective stewards for the continuing vitality of mission. Reminded that "new occasions teach new duties," we embrace change and commit ourselves to discerning the responsibilities and opportunities to which God calls us in each new day.

For the direction of our life and ministry, we are committed to:

Glorify God in our worship and service, "equipping the saints" to show the good news of Jesus Christ by the story we tell, by the values we live, by the choices we make;

Grow in faith, manifesting its joy and risk, nurturing new generations in its promises, and inviting others to share the journey; *Attend to human need* in both congregation and world, address the issues of our time in dialogue with our faith, and affirm the love and teachings of Jesus Christ through our mission.

What is the congregation's or organization's vision for ministry:

Immanuel Presbyterian Church is a healthy and vital congregation of the Presbyterian Church (USA) in downtown Milwaukee. Our membership includes individuals and families of all kinds who seek an inclusive, urban, Christian community in which to belong, learn, grow, and serve. We use the phrase "transforming tradition" to identify our particular style of worship and service. We take seriously our deep roots in the reformed tradition, and believe it is a tradition that reforms and transforms us. We also believe it is for us to help transform this tradition as we live it out in and for a new day. Worship is our first priority, with preaching that engages the Scriptures and the issues of our time, and a strong music program. Christian education is emphasized for persons of all ages, from preschool through adulthood. Immanuel is a place where people can bring questions of faith and meaning and find a supportive community in which to engage these questions together. We seek to practice radical hospitality, where all are welcome and various kinds of diversity (age, race, gender, sexual orientation, family size and context) are celebrated. The congregation also takes seriously the call of Christ to be "salt and light" in the world, providing opportunities to participate with others in mission and service.

How do you feel called to reach out to address the emerging needs of your community or constituency:

Immanuel Church believes that we are called to affirm the love and teachings of Jesus Christ through service and working for justice for all God's children. As a congregation rooted in the city of Milwaukee, we seek to address issues that impact this large, urban area. A sizable mission budget supports agencies in the city that work in a variety of areas, including poverty, homelessness, food insufficiency, domestic violence, and community development. Members regularly volunteer at a local shelter for women and families, another shelter that operates out of a Presbyterian church on the city's south side, a neighborhood food pantry, and Milwaukee Habitat for Humanity. The congregation and many of its members are actively involved with a community organizing group that is engaged in areas such as housing, jobs, and gun violence, as well as with the Interfaith Conference of Greater Milwaukee. In recent years, we have focused educational programming, book discussions, and community conversations on issues of racial inequality and white privilege. We provide opportunities for children and youth to learn about these issues, as well, and to engage in mission and outreach through the Souper Bowl of Caring, a sandwich ministry for homeless adults, and bi-annual summer mission trips, most often in other urban areas.
