After unexpectedly surviving Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, Mike and his wife Cathy set out on a mission to allow him to use his engineering skills to help others around the globe. Previously, Mike was a senior program manager with CH2M HILL where he managed multi-Billion dollar transportation projects such as the design for the Marquette, Mitchell and Zoo interchanges in the Milwaukee area. A member of Peace Lutheran Church in Muskego and Engineer Without Borders, Mike has led over 70 international service projects across 5 continents, with a focus on walking and vehicle bridges, schools and potable water.

In 2018 Mike was called upon to work with the Guatemalan Army Engineers in the aftermath of the Fuego volcano eruption that affected 1.7 million people and in September, to the Bahamas in response to massive destruction caused by Hurricane Dorian. Mike is a graduate of Michigan Technological University with a BS in Civil Engineering and a BS in Surveying.

Will Ulrich

Will Ulrich holds a bachelor's degree from UW-Milwaukee and a master's degree in Curriculum & Instruction from Concordia University. He has been teaching music in the Milwaukee area since 1995 and has been a professor of music at Mount Mary University since 2012. In 2013 Mr. Ulrich joined Will Schmid's World Music Drumming teaching staff, leading team building workshops across the United States, facilitating workshops in leadership, cooperative teamwork and multiculturalism through singing, drumming, and strumming throughout the country.
