Land and History Acknowledgement

Preface

Providing the land acknowledgement at the beginning of public meetings and events first started in Australia in the 1970s to give honor to the Aboriginal peoples and as a way to increase the rights of these Indigenous peoples. It traveled to Canada, where people wanted to raise awareness of the horror of Boarding Schools and the children who were separated from families, language, culture and religion. In the United States, we Presbyterians have been giving a Land Acknowledgement for some time now, to give honor to the peoples who lived on this land before us.

As 2021–2024 Presbyterian Women, Inc. Vice Moderator and Chair of the Justice & Peace Committee, I began to think about the Land Acknowledgement not only to remember and honor Indigenous peoples but also a way to remember our history—a history fraught with white supremacy, racism and violence. It seems that so many of us are looking for ways to forget our past and move beyond the sorrow we caused in the name of Manifest Destiny, but until we confront and embrace our history, we cannot possibly move forward in love!

This Land Acknowledgement is evolving. It recognizes that the land we call the United States was stolen from its traditional Indigenous inhabitants and caretakers. The statement also confesses the injustices perpetrated against people living on this land, based on their race, ethnicity, gender or sexual identity, place of birth, or religion.

The Land Acknowledgement may be read aloud by one or more speakers. The text about a particular group or community should be read by someone not of that social identity. For example, if you are using this Land Acknowledgement as part of a meeting where only women are present, omit the part about gender inequality. If a white male is present, have him read that part. Likewise with other parts.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE GATHERING OF PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN IN ST. LOUIS

The 2024 Churchwide Gathering where the theme was “LOVE” --Loving Ourselves, Our Neighbors, Our Community, Our World and the theme color was “RED”!!

The REDress Project raises awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Relatives. Red dresses hanging in public spaces serves as a reminder of Native women who disappeared or were killed. Similar to Amber Alerts for missing children, a Red Dress Alert would send emergency notifications to the public when an Indigenous woman, girl or two-spirit person goes missing. Racial Equity Dialogue (RED) Training with representatives from every Synod participating for a full day before the Gathering. The purpose of each Synod’s RED team is to build an inclusive caring community between women based on their beliefs and norms through the use of dialogue.

Eight women represented John Knox PW at the August Churchwide Gathering in St. Louis, MO. Janine Brandt and Sue Ingels participated in the Wednesday/Thursday business meetings and were joined for the Thursday through Sunday Gathering by Ruth Hein, Kate Dooley, Joyce Buseman, and Ann Rowley (Madison, WI); Beth Kerr (Oelwein, IA), and Julie Miller (Maynard, IA). We appreciate Sue's service as our Synod's Representative to the PW Board of Directors. The Gathering theme was "Do Everything in Love" and featured wonderfully inspiring plenaries, music, dance, prayer, workshops, learning, shopping, and fun. The plenary speakers were amazing ... breaking out the main theme into "What's Love Got to Do With It?," "Loving Our World," "Loving Our Neighbors," "Loving Ourselves," "Loving Our Community," and "Loving Out Loud." Some workshops I attended included "When They Say Protect Me: Our Missing and Murdered Indigenous Relatives," "Enough is Enough! Direct Action to End Gun Violence in the U.S.," "Family Disaster Preparedness Training," and "Best Practices for Saving and Sharing PW History." Presbyterian Women in the Synod of Lakes and Prairies enjoyed lunch and fellowship together and Julie took part in a presentation about USAME. It was truly a blessing to be a part of the Churchwide Gathering, and I thank JKPW for the opportunity to represent you.

From Maggie Horak: Reflections of Presbyterian Women Churchwide Gathering:

As I reflect on my time at the St. Louis Presbyterian Women Churchwide Gathering, I'm thankful for my passengers that made the six and a half hour drive a positive experience. With grace and patience, we discussed politics from (almost) opposite ends of the spectrum. That blessing helped each of us learn that the other is not like the extremes often reported in the mainstream media. It was a wonderful way to 'begin' the journey.

This was my fourth Gathering and continue to be so impressed and proud of the leadership and planning by the Gathering Team. Things that were beyond the planers control (i.e. hotel elevator & escalator issues) seem minor on reflection. The physical space of the plenaries, workshops, and (most) meals were adequate and beautiful. Rooms over here and up/down a level or two---I finally got it on the 2nd day. Information and helpers along the way made me feel

very cared for during my time. Food was an opportunity to try new things without preparing them myself: who knew eggplant could be so good?!

“Do Everything in Love” was a wonderful theme that was explored at each plenary. Seeing & listening to women from different parts of the country and with different viewpoints was educational and inspiring. ‘What’s Love Got to Do With it?’ was a night to remember.... free to dream and become what God intends instead of putting my own limits on ‘perceived’ abilities. ‘Loving Our Neighbors’ brought me firsthand words from Puerto Rico that helped me understand beyond what I read in the headlines. “Loving Ourselves” was especially important to me in the statement: [we are] “called to ACT in love to help others THRIVE.” They keynote was Laura Cheifetz that powerfully reminded me to ‘love ourselves as courage’ and that, in these times, “loving ourselves is counterculture.” Saturday evening banquet was “Loving Our Communities” that realize that PW has helped me grow as a woman and a person. Meeting with women that I’ve been in contact across the country was so personally heart-warming. The passing of my mother this year, I realize that I have much support from several women far and near that love and support me through this part of life’s journey. It was wonderful to greet, smile & hug them again after the very long COVID hiatus (Facebook friends just don’t cut it for me!) Sunday morning “Loving Out Loud” was the perfect bow on the event. Thank you, CeCe Armstrong, for sharing your message and being that bold, calm, loving voice of the PW and PC(USA).

A unexpected blessing was when former PW Moderator, Carol Winkler, caught me in the moving crowd and thanked me so much for the table favor she received when she visited Homestead Presbytery. What an amazing woman!

In closing, I can’t help but think about the subtext theme from ‘Do Everything in Love’: ***Did you eat yet?***

TOGETHER IN SERVICE

‘Answering the call to be the hands and feet of Christ in the World.’

“Each one should use whatever gift one has received to serve others, faithfully administering God’s grace in its various forms.” (1 Peter 4:10)

After attending the churchwide gathering this past month, I was moved by how the theme *“Do Everything in Love”* seemed to touch every topic, discussion, and event we had. As I reflected on Love, I remembered a mission of love that is run by a family I know. Their work is funded in many ways such as volunteering at Twins and Vikings games and concerts, recycling aluminum cans and ink cartridges, seeking corporate sponsors and grants, and by receiving personal donations.



That organization is **Houses for Haiti**. They are a nonprofit organization in Minnesota. What impresses me the most about the organization is that out of funds raised less than 2% is set aside for overhead. No one takes a ‘salary,’ and everyone works toward the goal. What a way to *Do Everything in Love!*

Their mission: “**They are** dedicated to building houses for homeless families living on the streets of Cite Soleil, the poorest slum in the Western Hemisphere. They also now are paying for 10 children’s education. They believe that “by changing one life it changes everything.”

Their goal: “To raise enough money each year to build one or two homes and sponsor children so they can go to school.

Their history: Diane Albright, co-founder and now president, had been volunteering in Haiti on mission trips since 2002 with Arlington Hills Presbyterian Church in St. Paul, Minnesota. In 2008, her sister, Linda Satriano, visited Haiti for the first time and saw the need to help the people they met. With her encouragement, Houses for Haiti, Inc. was founded in April 2008.

What they do: With the assistance of Pastor Leon Dorleans in Cite Soleil, they select one or two deserving families each year who have been homeless. The families who are chosen will be the recipient of a new, two-room cement home. Pastor Dorleans contracts with the builders and the “Houses for Haiti team” paints the home(s), and visits the families, bringing them small gifts from the United States.

Each house costs about \$6,000 to build. They have built 41 houses to date. This home below was built in 2023 and is occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Mompremier and their 5 children.

Since I have been involved with our TIS committee, your generosity helped with the following hands-on missions which your P.W. Moderator participated in with love:

Laverne, MN

Tying quilts and collecting supplies for the local crisis center. All items were sorted and packed up for distribution.

Sioux City, IA

Collected items needed to assemble baby layette kits for our sisters in the Dakota Presbytery to be used in the ceremony to Welcome the Child.

Rochester, MN

Your P.W. moderators put together 67 layettes over many hours of work.

Collected RX bottles from your presbyteries and sorted them by bottle #, clean or not cleaned, and those that could not be used by the Matthew 25 Ministries or the free clinic in Milwaukee, WI. We received well over 2000 bottles and got through the majority of them.

For our upcoming October CT meeting in West Salem, WI we are collecting non-perishable food items, as well as items to fill a special birthday bag, for the Community Care and Share Food Pantry which serves several of the small communities in and around West Salem. Your P.W. moderators will assemble birthday bags for the Food pantry at the meeting.


For 2025, we would like to hear from you as to what our main focus for missions should be. A couple of suggestions are:



Wandering Stars

by Tommy Orange



This book study is sponsored by Presbyterian Women in the Synod of Lakes and Prairies and led by members of the PWS Native American Concerns Committee. **It is open to interested women and men across the synod**, via Zoom. There is no charge to participate, yet registration is required.

Dates for 2024: October 14 and 28, November 4

Daytime study begins at 1:30-2:30 PM (CST)

Evening study begins at 6:30-7:30 PM (CST)



NOTE: It will be helpful if you read the book, "There There" by Tommy Orange prior to this book.

Synopsis: Tommy Orange's *Wandering Stars* is an ambitious family saga that is both a prequel and sequel to his brilliant debut novel, *There There*. It follows a family for over 150 years, from Jude Star escaping the Sand Creek Massacre in 1864 to the Bear Shield/Red Feather family in present day Oakland. In the family's struggles against institutionalized violence, genocide was only the beginning. Each generation inherits the trauma of their ancestors while facing fresh injustices. The government-sponsored erasure of Native American identity, cultures, languages and beliefs doesn't completely strip them of their heritage, but what survives is fragmented and incomplete. Star and his descendants try to rebuild their shattered identity, either by reconstructing the pieces or by replacing them with other things: sometimes art, sometimes addiction, often both.
