All roads lead to Louisville for the 2018 Churchwide Gathering of Presbyterian Women, August 2-5! Turn on your GPS, turn off your hectic schedule and arrive at the lovely Galt House in Louisville for worship, fun, fellowship, connection and spiritual uplift!

# Registration begins January 15, 2018

Join Presbyterian Women from around the country and sisters in faith from around the world for this triennial event.

Why attend this Churchwide Gathering? It's an event that deepens one's faith through Bible study, worship, and plenary sessions with inspirational speakers. Participants learn about mission opportunities and justice & peace issues through workshops, forums, tours and international guests. There's book discussion groups, resource gathering and shopping, spirituality center, exercise classes, reconnecting with friends and creating new friendships... and so much more.

Scholarships are available for EVERY attendee from the Presbytery of Milwaukee! A \$300 scholarship will be provided for every person attending this event, upon request and with proof of registration. Synod luncheon, why should I register for this? Our

PW Synod of Lakes and Prairies will host a luncheon on Saturday, August 4<sup>th</sup>, 12-1:30 PM at the Galt House. This provides an opportunity to gather as a synod, connect with our PW synod officers, as well as enjoy a meal and program together. To register for this synod luncheon, you must register and pay for your synod lunch (\$32) when you register for the Gathering. You will get reimbursed for one-half of the luncheon costs (\$16). Don't forget to register for this special event!

**Registration** online (<u>www.presbyterianwomen.org/gathering</u>) and by mail for the Gathering begins on January 15<sup>th</sup> - just a few days away! You are encouraged to register early so that you get your first choice for workshops, tours, etc.

**Registration booklets available**: If you subscribe to Horizons magazine, you received a registration booklet with your Nov/Dec issue. . . consider sharing your registration booklet if you won't be using it! If you are not able to access the registration form online, you can obtain copies by calling 844/797-2872, ext. 8015.

**Registration costs** \$425. This includes three meals (lunch on Friday; dinner on Thursday and Saturday), programs, exhibits, workshops and a program book.

**Hotel reservations** can be made at the Galt House online (<a href="www.presbyterianwomen.org/gathering">www.presbyterianwomen.org/gathering</a> for link) or by phone (800/843-4258) beginning January 15th. If you stay at the Galt House, you will receive a daily \$5 voucher for food purchased in the Galt House. The Galt House has a number of sleeping room options, with rates from \$144-\$179. There are other hotel options in the area that you can explore, if you wish.

**Carpooling and roommate connections:** If you need a roommate or would like to carpool to the Gathering, contact Helen McMasters or Judy Bell (contact information on page one).

**Gift cards:** Consider bringing (or sending) \$10 prepaid Target, Walmart, CVS or Walgreens gift cards to the Gathering. (\$10 per card only, please). The gift cards will be distributed to the following three organizations:

- The D.I.A.P.E.R. Project (Diapering Infants and providing Emergency Resources), Charlestown, IN, which provides diapers, nutritious food and first-aid supplies to families who are struggling financially and have infants and small children.
- Kentucky Refugee Ministries, Inc. (KRM), Louisville, KY, which provides resettlement services to refugees through faith- and agency-based cosponsorship.
- Lily's Place, Huntington, WV, which provides medical care to infants suffering from Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) and offers non-judgmental support, education and counseling services to families and caregivers.
