## **BUSINESS RECAP**

The Presbytery had a busy night, approving a renewal of the partnership with Dangme-Tongu Presbytery in Ghana, an increase of 1.2% to minimum terms of call, the dissolution of the Calvary Administrative Commission, and the sale of Grace Milwaukee's manse. It also had a first read on changes to the Manual of Operation to realign commission responsibilities to be more responsive to needs in the Presbytery, changes to the Foundation's bylaws to streamline its investment work, and the 2020 budget.
