Dear Tabor Village Families and Friends:

Tabor Village has implemented a pandemic plan to protect the health and safety of residents/tenants, their families and friends, and employees during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Dr. Bonnie Henry, British Columbia's Provincial Health Officer announced today additional measures to protect seniors in care by restricting visitors to essential visits only.

All non-essential visits to Tabor Village are suspended until further notice.

Essential visits are defined as both compassionate visits as well as visits required to support individual care needs such as families who visit to help with feeding and mobility.

At this time, **ONLY** people visiting residents/tenants who are very ill or requiring end of life care are permitted to enter the buildings.

Upon arrival, you will be asked further questions to determine if you may proceed with your visit.

The visitation policy will be reviewed in the future pending any changes made by The Provincial Health Officer.

During the visitor restrictions we ask you to keep in touch with loved ones by phone or other technologies, as available. Active screening will continue at a single point of entry for essential visitors and staff at all Tabor Village buildings.

We regret the inconvenience this may cause for you, your family members and friends; however, we must do everything we can to prevent the spread of COVID-19 to vulnerable older adults and the people who provide care to them. We appreciate your patience and understanding.
