

This Data Story shares information about the Wraparound process including the impact of Wraparound on children and families receiving care coordination within Connecticut's Behavioral Health Network of Care.

Data in this Data Story was collected as part of the evaluation of CONNECTing to Care conducted by the Yale Consultation Center.

## What is Wraparound?

Wraparound is a process for improving the lives of children with complex needs.

Wraparound guides children and caregivers to develop an individualized Plan of Care.

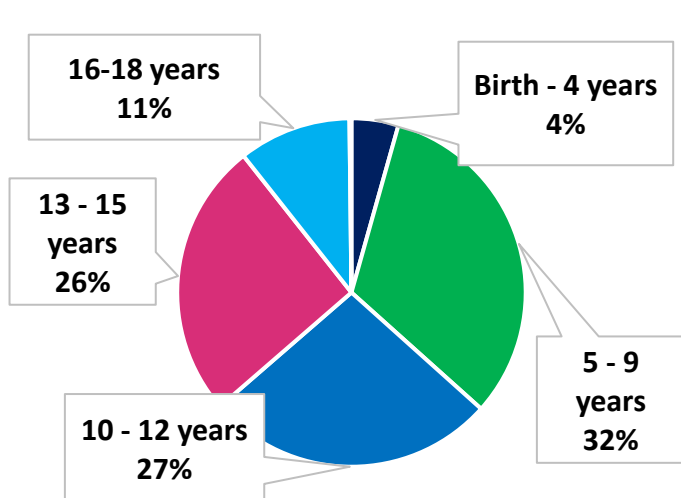

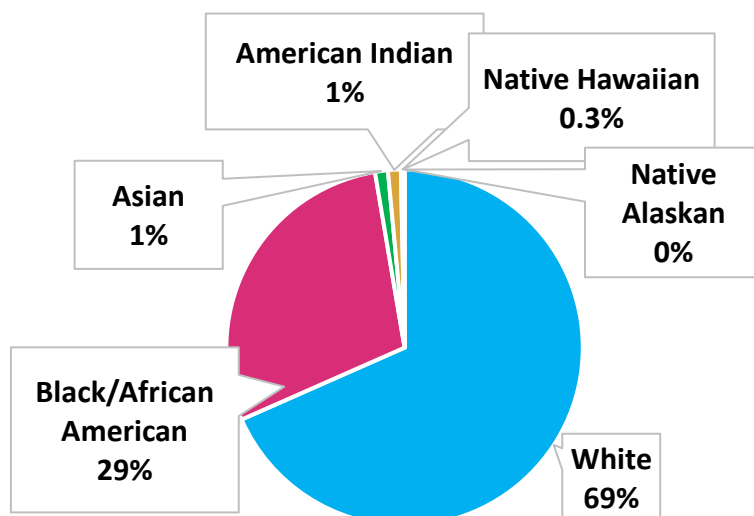
## Who were the children & youth served by Wraparound?

In evaluating the Wraparound process, intake & six-month follow-up data was collected from **2200** youth and caregivers receiving care coordination between November 2016 and September 2020.

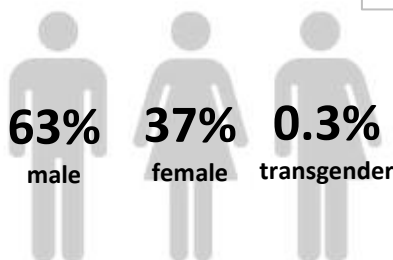
**Age** Most were between **5 and 15 years** of age.



**Race** Over half were white & **29%** were Black/African American.



**Gender** Two-thirds identified as male.

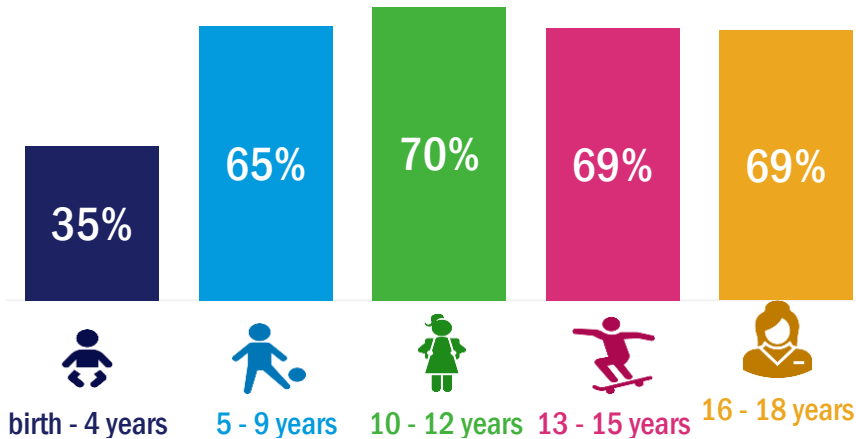


**Ethnicity** **17%** reported that they are Hispanic/Latino.

# More findings from the evaluation ...

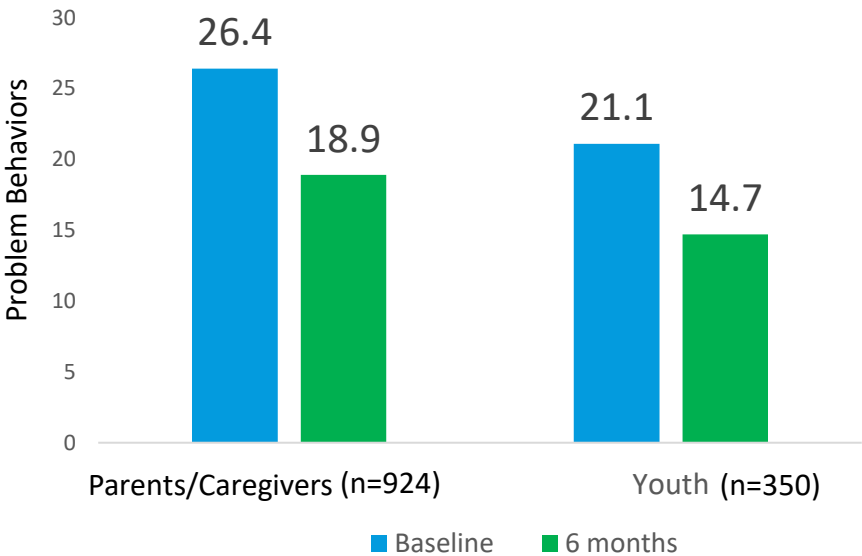
## Exposure to trauma

Caregivers report that about **two-thirds** of children and youth receiving care coordination were exposed to one or more traumatic events before enrolling in care.



## Outcomes for children & youth

After 6 months in care coordination...



Youth and caregivers reported that youth's **problem behaviors** significantly decreased.

Youth and caregivers reported that the youth's **functioning** significantly increased.
