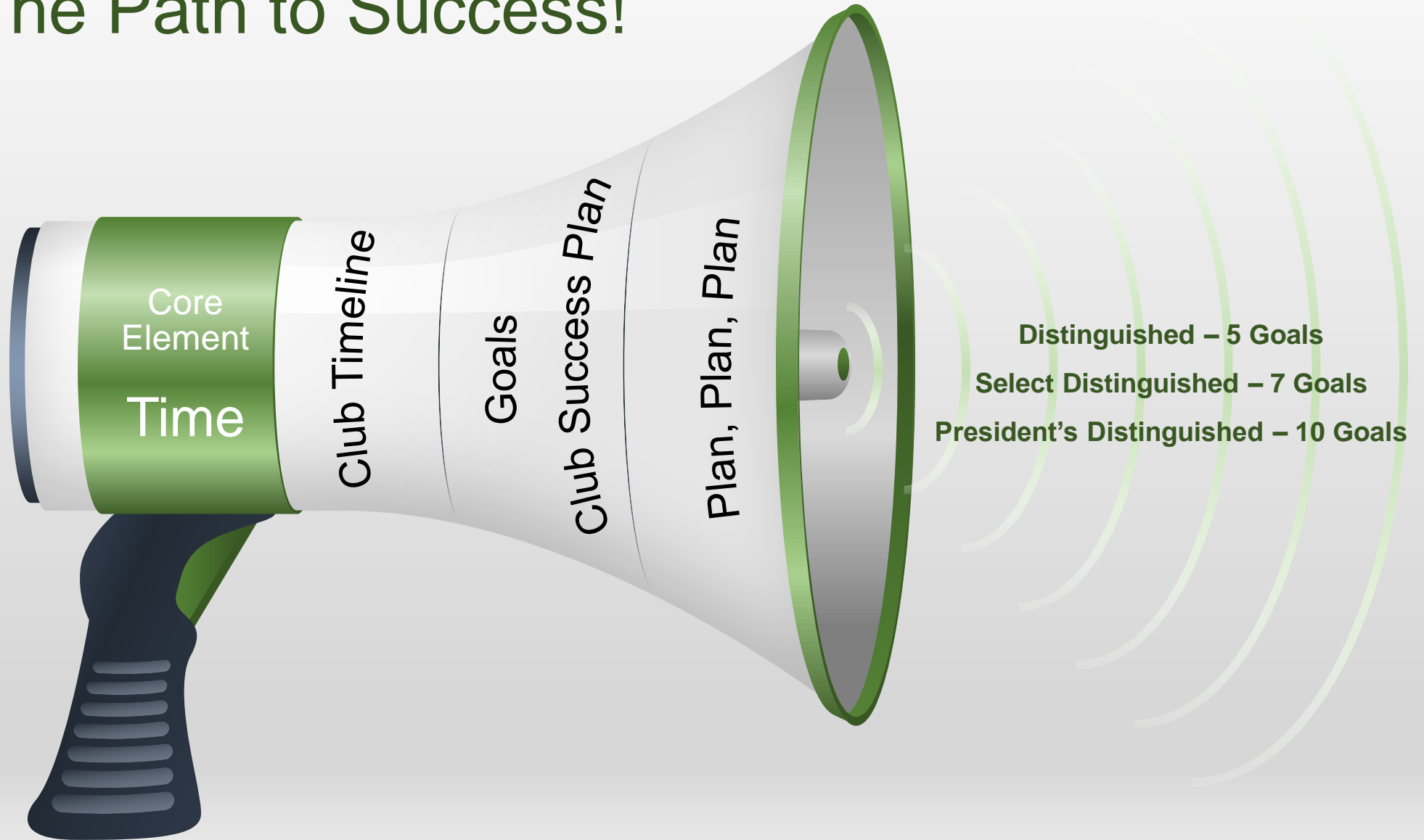






 - Asset in their performance report since they are developing speaking skill needed to communicate with members

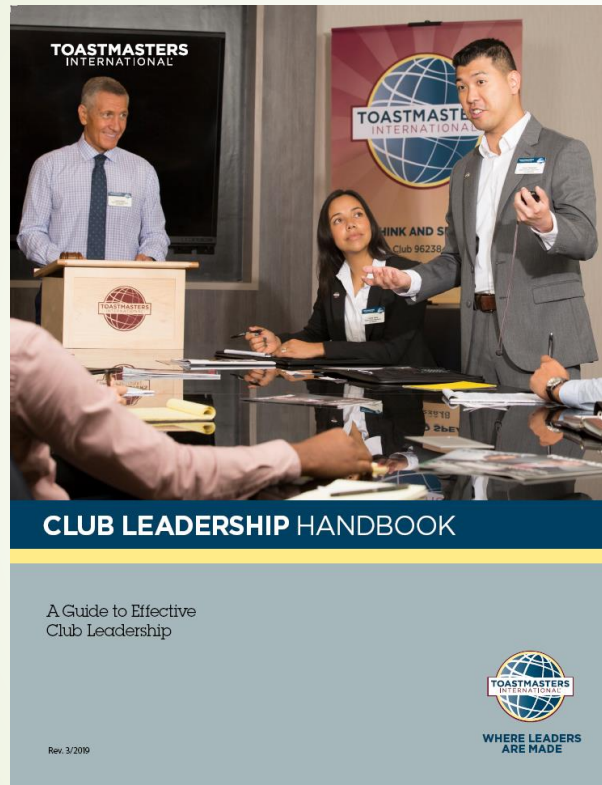
1. Strong hold from Learning & Development

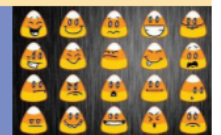

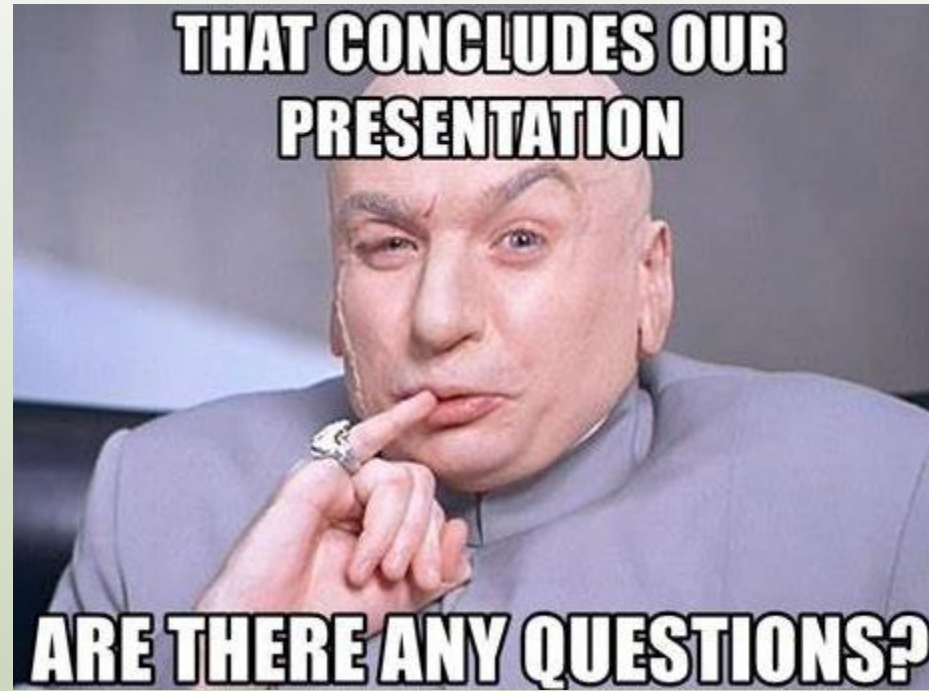
