Lesson: Exodus 32:7-14

The Lord said to Moses, "Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshiped it and sacrificed to it, and said, 'These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!"

The Lord said to Moses, "I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation." But Moses implored the Lord his God, and said, "O Lord, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? The Communion - All baptized Christians are welcome to receive Communion. To receive, come forward to the Altar rail. Those unable to may remain in their seats or come to the step at the end of the line and the elements will be brought to them. Communicants may receive the blessed host in the hand, held out right on top of left. The chalice follows. To drink, use the base of the chalice to guide it to the lips. To intinct, leave the host in the hand. The Minister will dip the host and return it. Self-intinction is not permitted. Reception in one kind is sufficient to fully participate in the Sacrament. Arms crossed indicates reception of a blessing instead of Communion.
