ROSH CHODESH MENACHEM AV

Rosh Chodesh is one day. We will take out a second Sefer Torah to read the Maftir that contains the Korban for every Shabbos and the Korban for Rosh Chodesh, from Parshas Pinchas.

Since we are in The Tree weeks, we will not say the Haftorah for Shabbos Rosh Chodesh, instead we will lein the Haftorah from Parshas Masei, which is the second of the three Haftorahs of impending destruction. Incidentally, the double sedra of Matos-Masei is the longest leining of the whole year.

SHAIMOS ALERT

As you can see elsewhere in the newsletter, there is a new organization that will collect Shaimos for a fee. At the same time, LINK is no longer able to avail itself of a free service to collect our Shaimos. So we stress again that Shaimos should NOT be brought to LINK as it will compel us to pay a fee to have it collected, which is a misuse of Tzedakah funds. According to the Psak that the Kollel follows from Rav Shlomo Miller in Toronto, unless a paper or a booklet has the literal name of Hashem in Hebrew, it can be disposed by placing it inside two bags and then putting it in a recycling can. It should NOT be brought to LINK. Any Seforim or other printed material that are made for long-term use should be put in Shaimos, but NOT at LINK. Please use the aforementioned service, by bringing it to The Mitzvah Store this Sunday and paying the appropriate fee.

THE NINE DAYS

While a few of the restrictions of the Nine Days begin with the onset of Shabbos this Friday night, with the exception of eating meat, drinking wine, and wearing freshly laundered – but not new-clothes. Please see the detailed restrictions below. The period commencing with Rosh Chodesh Av is called the "Nine Days." During this time, a stricter level of mourning is observed, in accordance with the Talmudic dictum (Ta'anit 26): "When the month of Av begins, we reduce our joy."

1. We avoid purchasing any items that bring great joy.
2. We suspend home improvements, or the planting of trees and flowers.
3. We avoid litigation with non-Jews, since fortune is inauspicious at this time.
4. We abstain from the consumption of meat (including poultry) and wine. These foods are symbolic of the Temple service, and are generally expressions of celebration and joy. On Shabbat, meat and wine are permitted. This applies also to any other seudat mitzvah -- for example, at a Brit Milah or at the completion of a tractate of Talmud. Wine from Havdallah should be given to a child to drink.
5. We refrain from wearing newly laundered garments, or laundering any clothes. If the "freshness" has been taken out of a garment prior to the Nine Days, it may be worn. Fresh clothes may be worn for Shabbat. The clothing of small

children, which gets soiled frequently, may be laundered during the Nine Days. Clothes may not be laundered even if done in preparation for after Tisha B'Av, or for after Tisha B'Av, or even if done by a non-Jew.

6. We do not bathe for pleasure. It is permitted to bathe in order to remove dirt or perspiration, or for medical reasons. This may be done only in cool water. Furthermore, the body should be washed in parts, rather than all at one time. Bathing in warm water is permitted on Friday in honor of Shabbat.

Note: Since we don't wear freshly laundered clothing during the Nine Days (excluding Shabbos), one should try on shirts/pants/skirts/blouses, etc. for at least 10 minutes before the Nine Days start. There is room to be lenient in regard to underwear and socks. (Laws taken from Aish HaTorah website)

Havdalah will first take place Sunday night after the fast (at home or at shul), consisting of the bracha over the wine/grape juice and the last paragraph only.**
