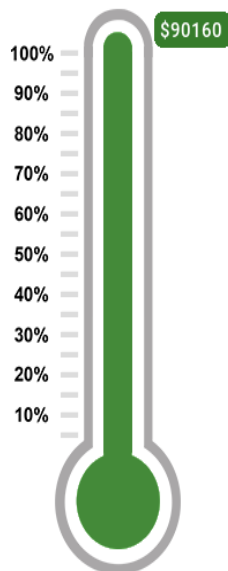

2022-2023 Shawano Christmas Bird Count Results

The Shawano Christmas Bird Count has been going on since 1965. 2022 was the 57th year for this annual count for the count area surrounding Shawano, Shawano Lake, Cecil, Clover Leaf Lakes down to the Navarino Nature Center. This year's count was on Saturday, December 17th, 2022. 31 parties participated for the Shawano Christmas Bird Count. 11 field observers, 22

counted birds at feeders. Shawano Lake was frozen, however the Wolf River was still open. Weather wise the low temp for the day was 25 F with a high temp of 34 F, and calm to gentle breeze. 47 species were observed, a total of 5,579 individual birds including: 315 Canada goose, 17 Trumpeter swan, 1 American Black Duck, 473 Mallard, 2 Bufflehead, 2 Common Merganser, 8 Ring-necked pheasant, 1202 Wild turkey, 1 Northern Harrier, 2 Cooper's Hawk, 1 Northern Goshawk, 16 Bald eagle, 8 Red-tailed hawk, 2 Rough-legged hawk, 502 Rock pigeon, 538 Mourning dove, 1 Red-headed woodpecker, 35 Red-bellied woodpecker, 104 Downy woodpecker, 34 Hairy woodpecker, 12 Pileated woodpecker, 1 American Kestrel, 1 Northern shrike, 141 Blue jay, 200 American crow, 5 Common raven, 2 Horned Lark, 134 Black-capped chickadee, 11 Tufted Titmouse, 41 Red-breasted nuthatch, 50 White-breasted nuthatch, 11 Brown creeper, 8 Eastern Bluebird, 992 European starling, 93 Cedar waxwing, 39 Snow Bunting, 221 American tree sparrow, 512 Dark-eyed junco, 130 Northern cardinal, 79 House finch, 18 Purple finch, 2 Red Crossbill, 8 Common redpoll, 1 Pine siskin, 320 American goldfinch, 3 Evening Grosbeak, and 279
