WORK HISTORY

February 1995-Present

Rector of Grace Episcopal Church, Norfolk, Virginia. The eighth rector in the one hundred and thirty two year history of the church. Grace is both a wonderful and challenging place to do ministry. There is something happening at Grace on a continuing basis. There is a solid commitment to an ongoing program of outreach which includes a foodbank that has grown from its inception to feed more than 16,000 people (or 4,000 families) annually. The church was designated a Jubilee Ministries Center in 1997, by the Executive Council of the Episcopal Church. Grace has a Community Development Housing Ministry, with Saint Paul's Episcopal Church, Norfolk, that became the largest builder of affordable housing in Norfolk. We completely redeveloped the Central Brambleton Neighborhood, building 75 of a total of 120 new homes. We have done two successful capital campaigns, the first a year after I arrived and the second four years ago required a complete move out of the sanctuary, removing the pews to completely replace the foundation and subflooring. We worshipped in the Parish hall during the renovation. Perhaps my most gratifying work is that I was blessed to mentor and sponsor four persons for ordination to the priesthood in the Diocese of Southern Virginia: The Reverend Howard Purvis, The Reverend Charles Miller, The Reverend Dennis Patterson and The Reverend Terry Edwards. Grace continues to do many outreach programs in efforts to improve the lives of our community.

May 1990-February 1995

Rector after being Deacon-In-Charge of Saint Stephen's Episcopal Church, Winston-Salem, North Carolina. While rector of this parish we were able to develop several outreach programs that targeted at-risk-youth. During my time here we increased membership, outreach and community awareness. We did a very unique capital campaign and building project that included developing parking and produced enough income to partially pay for the project and perpetually provided an income stream.

Pastor and Founder, Good Samaritan Church, Durham, North Carolina. Starting with zero members, through door to door evangelism, personal visitation and community involvement, developed a fully structured and organized church.
