



Michigan is the only state in the Midwest without Licensing for Acupuncture.

Acupuncture is a licensed profession in 46 states in the US.

Nearly 10 years ago the Board of Acupuncture was created and Registration of Acupuncturists was established. ***It is time to transition to licensure!***

KEEP MICHIGAN SAFE

- Currently **in Michigan there are no minimum training requirements** for an individual to provide acupuncture treatments to the public.
- As the only state in this region without licensure, **Michigan residents are exposed to an increased risk** of organ puncture, nerve damage, and infection resulting from improperly performed acupuncture.

SUPPORT SMALL BUSINESS

- Regulatory restrictions and the **lack of Licensure drive professional Acupuncturists from the state** and discourage recent graduates from returning to Michigan.
- Michigan is the only state in the region that requires Registered Acupuncturists (RAc) to sign a supervision agreement with a physician, which increases red tape without increasing safety.
- Bureau of Labor Statistics data projections show that Acupuncture is expected to grow rapidly over the next decade.
