Weddings are celebrated only on select Saturdays at 11 AM and/or 2 PM, in either Holy Name or Sacred Heart. Please complete a Wedding Inquiry on the parish website to begin the process at least 9-12 months prior to the desired date.

Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth.

—1 John 3:18

From the time I was a small child, my father would say to me that actions speak louder than words. So I find it interesting that this scripture passage comes along at the same time that I have been reading the Interfaith Alliance of Wake County document, The Ethical Framework.

In writing of today's reality, the document states, "Self-interest in America has reached the point of entitlement, where it is acceptable to pursue individual rights and personal interest without regard to the effect on others or the community...Clear behavioral expectations and responsibilities are a missing link in our democracy. Without norms for commonly expected ethical and moral behavior, there is little if any expectation or law that behavior must be ethical, responsible, or fair, as long as it is legal. People, even our leaders, defend unethical and immoral behavior by saying 'I've done nothing illegal.' Nevertheless, behavior without a moral or ethical conscience, whether legal or illegal, is often hurtful to others and to the common good. . . knowing what is right is often not transformed into doing what is right."

The underlying precepts of The Ethical Framework are not unlike the social teachings of the Catholic Church: "Respect for the basic dignity and worth of every person; consideration for the interest of others and the common good; consideration of all actions in terms of desirable ethical and moral outcomes, rather than on solely legal, or convenient results." Rather than solve problems, the four principles proposed in the document provide a foundation that empowers individuals to build solutions and guide daily living. These principles are:

1. Be FOR people rather than AGAINST people. (Consider others. Consider the common good.)
2. Treat people with care and concern, strive for harmony. (Build caring, trusting relationships.)
3. Respect the wonder of life. (Life is precious and sacred.)
4. Accept responsibilities as members of society. (Obligations to yourself, to others, to society.)

RCIA is an excellent way to share your love of the Catholic Church and help those journey closer to Christ. I myself made a conversion to the Catholic Church through the RCIA program in the year 2000. RCIA and my sponsor made this possible. For me, RCIA was life changing. Many years later I was asked to help others on this same journey by being a sponsor. Sponsoring in RCIA is vital for those entering the Church. Sponsoring a Seeker is not difficult. You're not required to be a church scholar or even an evangelist. You're there to walk with the seeker and to help out whenever possible. Even if you don't know how to help with certain situations, you can be that liaison to someone who can. Simply put, Sponsoring offers a sense of comfort to those entering the Church. 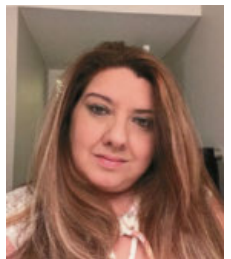
Katherine Lee

Don & Sandy Ingrassano

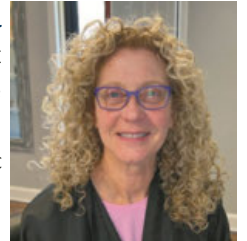

Cathy Spargo Frieda

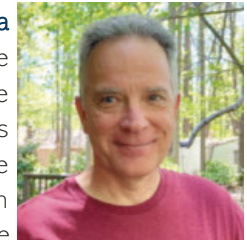

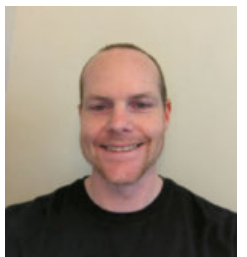


DM Lawson

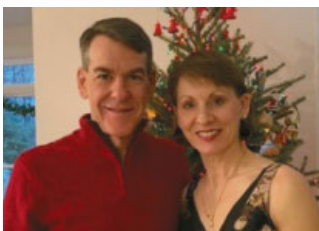


Scott and Peggy Sharp

Pregunta: ¿Cómo se convierte una persona en santo canonizado?

Respuesta: ¡Es importante recordar que todos los santos son personas, personas reales que vivieron tal como nosotros! Los primeros santos de la Iglesia fueron mártires o teólogos conocidos por una vida santa. Con el tiempo, la Iglesia ha establecido un proceso para investigar las causas de los santos.

Después de la muerte de una persona santa, el obispo de su diócesis inicia el proceso de canonización ante el Vaticano. Por lo general, deben esperar cinco años para asegurarse de que cualquier falso entusiasmo haya disminuido. Con la aprobación del Vaticano, comienza el proceso y la persona recibe el título de "Siervo de Dios." La primera fase consiste en recopilar información sobre la vida de la persona y examinarla detenidamente. Una persona tiene la función específica de plantear dudas: ¡de ahí la frase "abogado del diablo!" Cuando está claro que la persona realmente vivió una vida heroicamente santa según las enseñanzas de la Iglesia, se la declara "Venerable."

Si la persona es mártir de la fe, también será declarada "Beata (o)." Si la persona no es un mártir, se le debe acreditar un milagro. Esto también se examina de cerca para determinar su autenticidad. Una vez autenticado el milagro como verdaderamente un milagro realizado por Dios a través de la persona o por su intercesión, ésta es beatificada. Se requiere un milagro adicional autenticado antes de la canonización, y podemos llamarlos "Santos."

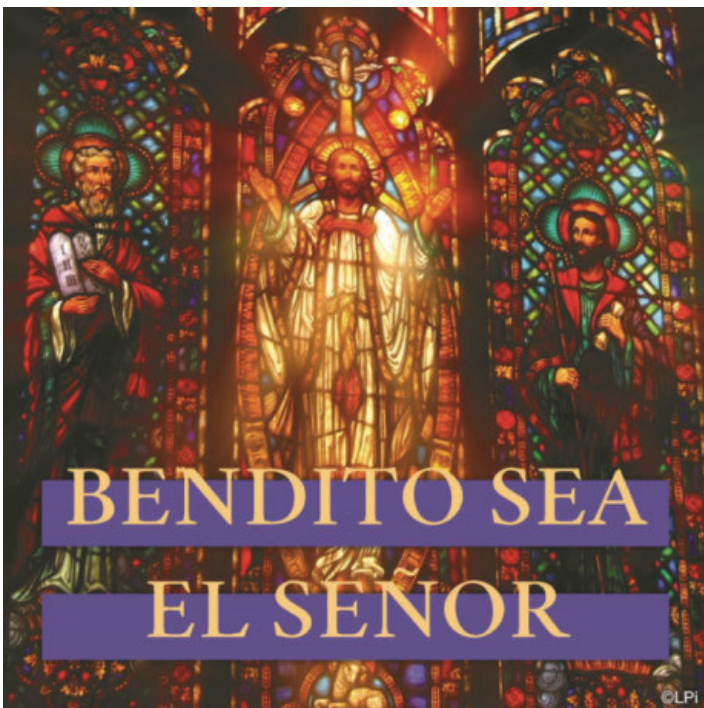
