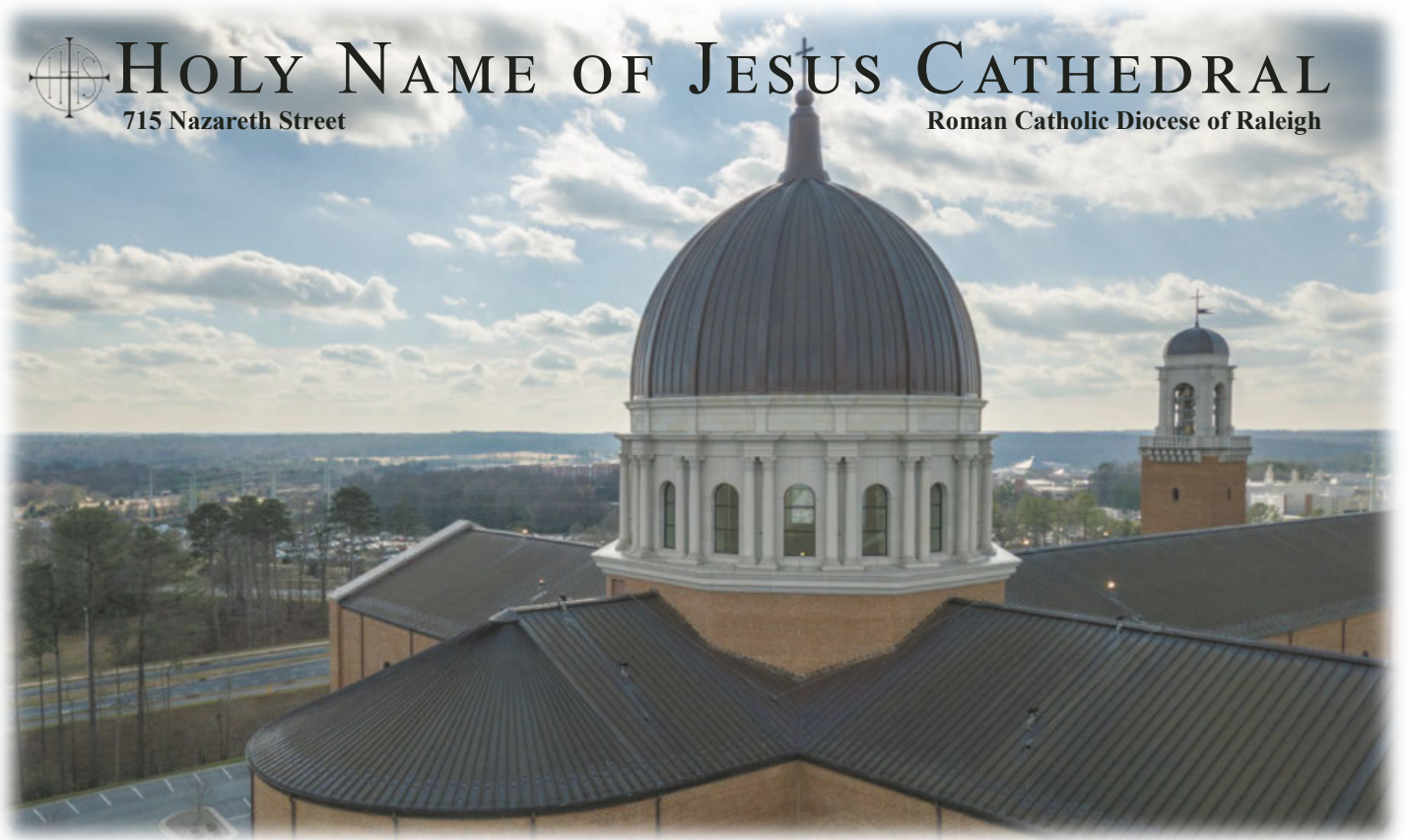

From the Pastor

In Thanksgiving for the Gift of New Life – I know you join me in expressing our sincere congratulations to our interim Director of Music and Organist for our Cathedral parish family, Dr. David Eaton, DMA and his wife, Dr. Lori-Ann Daley, MD, as they welcome the gift of their first child, Isabelle Yvonne Daley Eaton. May Our Lord watch over, guide and protect little Isabelle and all newborns in their first steps in this world, as we together also give thanks for the gift of their life and through them, new life to others.

Christmas Wish List and End of the Year Giving: Filling Out our New Parish Center – With our new Parish Center now finally beginning to take shape, a few items on the list to fill-out our new Center and for your end of the year giving consideration. New Year's Resolution: Embracing the Spirituality of Tithing – Tithing is a biblical spiritual value through which we reflect gratitude to Our Lord for His blessings to us, as well as reflect His generosity. As a regular discipline in the spiritual life, consistency in tithing keeps these values in front of us always, lest we lose focus towards self-centeredness and greed. The Bible speaks of tithing not as an obligation, but rather as part of remembering our relationship with God and all He has done and is doing for us. The Biblical value thus of a 10% of our income given is a commitment to express that gratitude and to express that generosity – a big number, agreed, but that is what the Bible teaches, perhaps so that we can not forget it or reduce it to a token. In living the stewardship journey through tithing the last 30+ years (giving 5% to the Church and 5% to a list of other charities), as with others doing so, I can say that when you make that commitment to tithing, its not so much that you miss that 10%, because you do not. If anything, it makes you more generous with others, and not in the monetary sense, but rather in how you are with others. Not a surprise, as in generosity, you are reflecting something of God's Life to others, plus in tithing, returning thanks to Him Who has made it all possible in the first place. Prayerfully review this Biblical commitment and make it a resolution for 2023.

Advent Reconciliation – As you prepare for how Our Lord comes anew into your life, we also consider how we encounter Him in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As a parish family, we will come together to pray the sacrament, with a brief Liturgy of the Word, followed by individual confessions, this coming Tuesday evening, December 20th at 7 pm at our Cathedral. Twenty brother priests will be joining us to assist us in our prayer. Plan to join us as we celebrate the freedom that only God can give us, as He does so in this sacrament. Note too, that our daily and Saturday celebration schedule for the sacrament is also available to you. As always, for your convenience, below an Examination of Conscience, based on the 10 Commandments, to guide your review of life in preparation to celebrate the sacrament:

1. ***I am the Lord your God. You shall not have strange gods before me.*** Do I give God time every day in prayer? Have I been involved with superstitious practices or have I been involved with the occult? Have I created other "gods" in my life, such as money, security, power, people, substance abuse, etc., that place Our Lord second or even last in my life?
2. ***You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.*** Have I used God's name in vain: lightly or carelessly? Have I wished evil upon any other person?
3. ***Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.*** Have I deliberately missed Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of Obligation? Do I do needless work on Sunday, avoid rest or spending time with others?
4. ***Honor your father and your mother.*** Have I neglected my duties to my parents, spouse and children? Have I given my family good religious example? Do I try to bring peace into my home life? Do I care for my aged and infirm relatives?
5. ***You shall not kill.*** Have I physically harmed anyone? Have I encouraged or helped anyone to have an abortion? Have I encouraged or condoned sterilization? Have I engaged in artificial insemination or in vitro fertilization? Have I participated in or approved of euthanasia? Have I purposefully injured the good reputation of another?
6. ***You shall not commit adultery.*** Have I been faithful to my vocation of life, to vows of marriage in thought and action? Have I respected all members of the opposite sex, or have I thought of other people as mere objects?
7. ***You shall not steal.*** Have I taken what is not mine? Have I returned or made restitution for what I have stolen? Do I waste time at work, school, and home? Do I gamble excessively, thereby denying my family of their needs?
8. ***You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.*** Have I lied? Have I gossiped? Do I speak badly of others behind their back? Am I sincere in my dealings with others? Am I critical, negative or uncharitable in my thoughts of others?
9. ***You shall not desire your neighbor's wife.*** Have I consented to impure thoughts or actions? Have I used reading, movies, television, internet or conversation to engage impurity?
10. ***You shall not desire your neighbor's goods.*** Am I jealous of what other people have? Am I greedy or selfish? Do I regularly participate giving thanks to God for His blessings by supporting the mission of our parish through offering and our Diocese through the Bishop's Annual Appeal? Are material possessions the purpose of my life?

Prayerful Best Wishes for Christmas – If this week ahead will take you out of town to family and/or friends, be assured of prayers for safe travels and on behalf of my brother priests, deacons and our entire parish pastoral staff, best wishes for a very joyous and blessed celebration of the Solemnity of the Incarnation of Our Lord, the Emmanuel – God with us! Merry Christmas!

Parish Center Grading Completed, Still Awaiting Building Permit from the City of Raleigh – With the grading work for our new Center now complete, we are still awaiting the City of Raleigh to approve our overall Building Permit. We did pay extra for a so called "express review" with the city to expedite the process, which resulted in some clarifications requested. Those have been submitted several weeks back, and so we are again waiting, which sadly is a regular experience among most contractors with projects in our city, too often impeding the blessings of growth and development. Thus, our project timing will now be set back a bit, but the steel arrival is still on schedule for on-site delivery in January 2023. So, step by step, a lot to look forward to as our new Center begins to take shape!

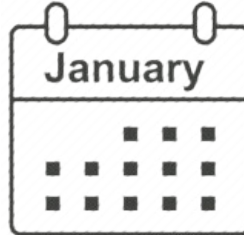

*Grace to you and peace from God our Father
and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Has the noise of the consumer bandwagon, endless Christmas music, and merrymaking overwhelmed these last few days of Advent? There were times when my children were small that I thought I could never get a moment's silence in the midst of so much Christmas activity and, I have to say, I found wonder in those precious days. Yet, I realized that if I was to prepare my own heart for the presence of the Lord, silence, solitude and self-gift were necessary ingredients to a richer understanding of the coming of the Lord. At a Rome parish on the First Sunday of Advent in 2013, Pope Francis said, "that life is a journey and the most beautiful gift we can receive is our encounter with Jesus. . . We meet Jesus in the sacraments, but we also meet Him when we do good deeds, when we visit the sick, when we help the poor, when we think of others, when we are not selfish. . ." (Vatican Radio via Missio app 12/1/13)

The Church's tradition of encouraging everyone to create time for waiting, watching, wondering, and welcome in these four weeks of Advent make this period one of the most spiritual. As you light your fourth Advent candle, invite others into the stillness. Breathe in the peace and calm. Let go of all distractions. Let your imagination take hold and picture a world where even the impoverished person has their needs and hopes met and they can be who they were created to be. Imagine yourself as God's instrument to help someone less fortunate in this new Church year of grace. Then, say this prayer:

Thank you, God, for sustaining us on our Advent journey as we go forth to welcome the One who is to come within us.

Plant within our hearts your living Word of promise as we seek to understand what we went out to see in the Advent wilderness.

Give us strength for witnessing, that we may go and tell others what we see and hear and help us to strengthen others.

Grant this through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

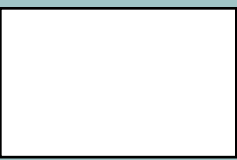

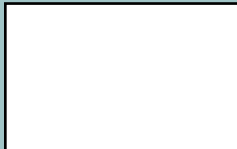
