All paperwork must be received at least 3 weeks prior to the confirmed scheduled date. Preparation & Catechesis for first time parents/godparents are held bi-monthly.

WEDDINGS

Weddings are celebrated only on select Saturdays at 11 AM and/or 2 PM, in either Holy Name or Sacred Heart. Please complete a Wedding Inquiry on the parish website to begin the process at least 9-12 months prior to the desired date.

EUCARIST at HOME

If you or a loved one would like to receive the Holy Eucharist at home due to illness or infirmity, our Camillus Ministry can attend to you. Please call the office or send an email to camillus@hnojnc.org and a staff member will be in touch to make arrangements suitable to you.

CATHEDRAL GIFT SHOP

To Whom Shall We Go?

A friend of mine, who is a far better Christian than I can ever hope to be, once shared with me that her family sneers at her belief system and lifestyle.

She believes in fairy tales they tell her. She's looking for simple solutions from a kind-faced man in the sky because she doesn't want to grapple with complicated answers to complicated problems.

Religion, they argue, is the easy way out.

As she spoke about this, her voice became unsteady. Not with anger, but with emotion. "I would never call this life easy," she said. "If I was looking for something that was easy, I wouldn't choose Catholicism."

What was unspoken was why she has chosen Catholicism. I know the answer, but only because I know her. I knew her before she chose it wholeheartedly, and I know her now, and I see the difference. I see that these words are written so clearly across the days of her life: "Master, to whom shall we go?"

Once the truth is known in your soul, you see, it can never be unknown.

Following Christ is not about easy answers and simple teachings. Sure, it all sounds very basic: love one another as I have loved you. What could be more straightforward?

But what does that mean? What does that look like in daily, modern life, in a world full of the fallen, whose flaws have given us rough edges and weakened wills?

I'll tell you what it looks like — it looks like a struggle. It looks like failure and mess and confusion and losing your way and finding it again, all because you remembered that within you there is a compass pointing due north. It's a constant state of wandering in the dark, following a Voice that asks you to go where you're afraid to go. And you follow the Voice not because it's the only voice there is and not because it's the voice that says what you want to hear, but because it's the only one that speaks the truth, and the truth pulls on you in a way you can't quite resist.

When Christ asks, "Do you also want to leave?" he is not gaslighting us. It's a genuine question. We are free to go. We are not prisoners.

But we have heard the words of everlasting life, and now we can only have peace if we follow where they lead.



WEBSITE CHANGES



To Help our Global Neighbors

We are highlighting a school in India where Fr. John received his education from 6th-10th grade and one that he would like us to help. Located in South India in the Anantapur District of the Andhra Pradesh State, the **St. Francis de Sales Boarding School** for boys is run by the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales. Currently, there are 106 boys enrolled, who come from nearby poor peasant families. They are running short of water for their daily use as they have only one water pump which has a very shallow well that is running dry. What is urgently needed is one additional borewell. To Help our Local Neighbors

The **Door Fund/Ministry** is unique to HNOJ Cathedral and began in 2002 as a way to meet the needs of the poor who, quite literally, came to the Cathedral office door in need of help. Formed and developed by Anne and Bill Werdel, the Door Fund/Ministry now serves the disadvantaged by helping them pay past due rents and avoid eviction. In the fiscal year 2023-2024, we helped 306 Wake County citizens as well as donated funds to Habitat for Humanity, Oak City Cares, Support Circle for families emerging from homelessness, and other organizations. Thanks to the caring hearts and financial donations of parishioners, our parish follows in Jesus' footsteps among the poor. We urgently need funds so that we can re-open once again after Labor Day in September.

THE FEAST OF SAINT MONICA | HOMECOMING



This weekend, we celebrate the Feast Day of Saint Monica on August 27, and today, we celebrate a piece of the history of the Catholic Church in Raleigh: the homecoming for Saint Monica's Church and School.

Named for St. Monica, the mother of St. Augustine, St. Monica's Church was established to serve Black Catholics in Raleigh and surrounding Wake County. The church and school were highly respected institutions in Raleigh for more than 35 years. According to reports in the Archives of the Diocese of Raleigh, Bishop William J. Hafey dedicated St. Monica's Catholic Church and School on the first Sunday of September 1930. Present at the dedication were 12 priests and 43 sisters, all who worked in the Diocese. Also present were 200 non-Catholic black people, according to St. Monica's first pastor, the Reverend Charles Hannigan, S.S.J., of the Josephite Fathers.

St. Monica's mission included a church, school, convent, rectory, and playground. The Quonset hut church building had a sandstorm finish. The school was thoroughly modern,

for the time, and included built-in radio equipment. St. Monica's buildings were located in the middle of one of the most beautiful sites in Raleigh at that time. The property was contained on two whole city blocks, at the corner of New Bern Avenue and Tarboro Street, near some of the finest homes, in one of the best communities for black people in Raleigh. It was located in sight of St. Agnes Hospital and St. Augustine University.

The 1931 Catholic Directory counted 23 Catholics as members of the parish. The initial school enrollment included 148 students. At the height of operations, Catholics at St. Monica numbered 266. One hundred eighty four students were enrolled in the school. The staff of the school included five Immaculate Heart of Mary (IMH) Sisters from Scranton, PA.

In the mid 1950's, the Catholic population in Raleigh began to grow. Our Lady of Lourdes, a split off of Sacred Heart Cathedral, opened on Anderson Street. St. Mary, Mother of the Church, in Garner was founded to serve Catholics in that area.

On June 12, 1953, Bishop Vincent S. Waters, third Bishop of Raleigh, issued a Pastoral Letter calling for the Desegregation of Catholic churches in North Carolina. This directive was issued one year before the U.S. Supreme Court's Brown vs. the Board of Education ruling, declaring separate public schools for black and white students to be unconstitutional. In his letter Bishop Waters stated clearly that "there is no segregation of races to be tolerated in any Catholic Church in the Diocese of Raleigh." In light of this, St. Monica's Church and School, as well as other Black Catholic institutions across North Carolina, were ordered to be closed immediately.

Saint Joseph Catholic Church was established on the corner of Poole Road and Peartree Lane. Sunday Masses for St. Joseph were held at St. Monica until St. Joseph Church was completed. With the formal dedication of St. Joseph Church in October 1968, parish life at St. Monica's Church and School came to a painful end. St. Monica parishioners were assigned to St. Joseph and Sacred Heart Cathedral in Raleigh, and St. Mary Church, in Garner. The church and rectory were torn down. A private owner moved the convent to another location. The property was sold to make way for what is now Edenton Street. A restaurant, Bojangles, also operates on the property. St. Joseph houses some of the artifacts of the parish. The brass bell from St. Monica was remounted at the entrance of Saint Joseph. A statue of St. Martin de Porres was moved to the grounds of St. Joseph.

The tremendous contributions of St. Monica's Church and School have been noted through the excellence of achievement that many adult leaders in Raleigh attribute to their early academic and religious training they received there. Bishop F. Joseph Gossman, fourth Bishop of Raleigh, stated in a letter to a homecoming gathering for former parishioners of St. Monica and former students, "It is regrettable that such a significant instrument for good has been lost, or gone out of existence. Perhaps, together you can help us to find ways to revive the spirit, the identity and the presence that once was associated with this religious institution, so that its existence may once again be a spark to the community of the present as it was in the past."

The school remains as the only building representing Saint Monica's Parish. The building was sold to the city and became the New Bern Avenue Day Care Center. In 2011 the city refurbished the building and turned it into a Teen Center, for after school programs for area teenagers. A computer lab and rooms for studying and completing homework are available. Tutoring and job preparation counseling are offered. A wall of history was dedicated to Monsignor Thomas Paul Hadden, a former student. The wall is an array of pictures and artifacts depicting life at Saint Monica's from the 1930's to the 1960's. At the dedication of the center, Monsignor Hadden stated that he was pleased that St. Monica's campus would continue to be used to support the development of our youth.






