From the President's Desk

It's that time again...time to prepare for the biennial convention for western North Dakota Women of the ELCA. Many of us are also preparing to join women from all over the United States at this summer's WELCA Triennial Convention in Des Moines. IA.

We are trying something new this go-round in hopes of welcoming more women, by partnering with Camp of the Cross Ministries (CCM) near Garrison and coordinating our convention with CCM's women's fall retreat! Doesn't that sound great?! Our theme will be addressing **The Gift of Loving One Another**, rooted in theme verse John 14:34, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." The convention retreat will be held on Saturday, October 24, with an optional evening of fellowship at the camp the evening before.

As we are also preparing for the WELCA Triennial Convention happening July 16-19, 2026, we are reviewing & appreciating the efforts our western ND WELCA women have made towards addressing the memorials and resolutions from the 2023 Triennial. Each of these requests for action that our sisters voted for express elements of our vision and mission, and I am struck daily by the elements of these statements that hold us to account in the turbulence currently happening in the US. For example, let me share the language of Memorial 2- Calling for Peace and Unity:

We, as Women of the ELCA, commit to strive for peace and unity in all that we do and say so that we may be a light filled with compassion and kindness for all in the midst of hatred, dissension, conflict, and violence that engulfs our world. That we, through our bond of sisterhood in Christ Jesus, encourage and promote harmony, unity, and peace within our homes, church, workplaces, schools, communities, and the country. That we, as Women of the ELCA, hold our local and national leaders in prayer asking the Holy Spirit to fill their hearts that they may become more open-minded, reaching across the aisles to work together for the good of the nation and all its citizens.

This memorial aligns perfectly with The Palm Sunday Path, a public witness of our Christian values as laid out for us by Jesus in Matthew 25. **I invite you all to join me** in this growing, ecumenical movement of Christians gathering for witness on Palm Sunday, March 29, 2026, at 3pm in a procession to the ND State Capitol grounds for a time of communal worship and prayer. This day was chosen because Jesus entered into Jerusalem at the beginning of Passover, on a donkey, as a just, humble leader reflecting the shared Biblical values of feeding the hungry, caring for the vulnerable and



welcoming the stranger. The goal of this movement is to stand up to violations of these values by our elected leaders and to call to every elected leader at every level – regardless of party – to work with us on policies that promote these values. Treasurer's Reflections

"Like a Dove"

What comes to mind when you hear the word "dove"? Does it remind you of a bird that is often used as a symbol of love? Does it suggest a bird that is often seen sitting on a grain bin that is often used as a target to shoot at? Does it remind you of a Bible verse or Bible story?

The dove is mentioned many places throughout the Bible. In some verses doves represent a symbol of peace or the Holy Spirit. In Genesis 8:8-12 Noah releases a dove to let him know that the flood waters had receded.

Several places in the Bible speak of using a dove, a pair of doves or turtle doves as sacrificial offerings to God. When Jesus destroys the temple where there are money changers, there is reference to doves being sold in the temple to be used as offerings.

A few weeks ago, the Gospel lesson was Matthew 3:13-17 where we heard of the baptism of Jesus. Verse 16 reads "After his baptism, as soon as Jesus came up out of the water, the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God coming down in the form of a dove." Though the wording may differ slightly, this event is recorded in all four of the Gospels. Other references to doves can be found in the Psalms, Leviticus, Song of Solomon, Isaiah and Ezekial.



I remember hearing the song "Wings of a Dove" as a child. This song has been recorded by several different artists over the years. The words remind us that God sends down his love "on the wings of a dove."

I was looking through the song titles in some of the hymnals that I have and saw the title, "Thy Holy Wings." While the song doesn't mention a dove specifically, I got the image of the wings of a dove surrounding me, the women of our organization, as well as all believers.

Every time you see, read about or hear about a dove in the future, may you be reminded of all the ways that a dove is pictured in the bible.

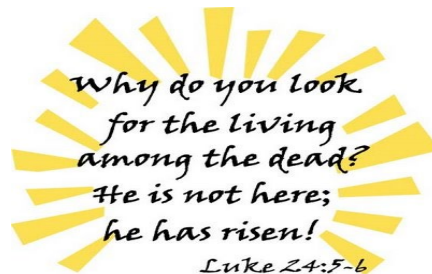

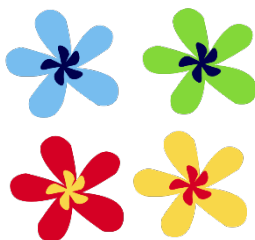

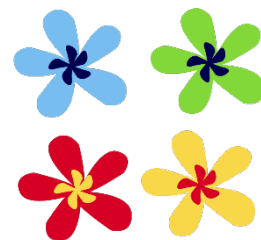

There is beauty in seeing that God is with us in the midst of our struggles and imperfections. As we soon enter our Lenten journey, let’s keep our eyes open to how we can help each other walk through those struggles and grow in this journey of faith. It helps me to remember that there aren’t “perfect” Christians-just MESSY folks with unique qualities.

Justice (Mission Community)

CFJ- A new organization I discovered to assist women, during my search for Justice articles. The Clooney Foundation for Justice is Amal and George Clooney's organization that wages justice by providing free legal aid in defense of free speech and women's rights in forty countries. They monitor and report on unfair trials, challenge unjust laws in the courts, establish legal aid clinics for the most vulnerable and support the next generation.

CFJ continues to work on issues that have long faded from the headlines. This includes co-founder Amal Clooney’s representation of Yazidi women who were raped and enslaved by ISIS, supporting survivors of atrocities in Congo and Sudan, and battling the epidemic of discrimination and violence against women and girls worldwide. They are in the fight for justice for the long haul, no matter how difficult the journey.

Their “Trial Watch Program” provides free legal aid to journalists who are unfairly imprisoned to secure their release. It is the first initiative to monitor criminal trials globally.

Their “Waging Justice for Women” program provides free legal aid to women and girls to defend their rights, including their right to be free from discrimination, child-marriage and violence.

They have empowered thousands of women to assert their rights and their advocacy is helping overturn and reform anti-democratic laws that governments misuse against women, journalists and democracy defenders. They have had 100% success rate before international human rights bodies, 1250 hearings monitored, 6500 women and girls receiving free legal services and 10,000 hours of free legal aid in defense of women and speech.

The Heart River Correctional Center is in need of baby items as pregnant women continue to be transferred to their care. What a gesture of love, to be able to send them off with starter items to help ease the burden of families making their pregnancy time feel special. Here are some current needs:

1. Newborn diapers (smaller packs are best)
2. Baby wipes
3. Baby hygiene items (lotion, baby wash, diaper cream, towels etc.)
4. Bibs/Burp cloths
5. Baby socks and onesies
6. Baby hats/glove sets
7. Footed snowsuits
8. Newborn or 0-3 month clothing (especially neutral or for girls).

When Jesus said, "Follow Me," He was not inviting people to admire Him from a distance or simply agree with His teachings. He was calling them into a completely new way of life - one of surrender, obedience, transformation, and mission.
