

Your child's early years matter...

Are you concerned about the way your child speaks, plays, or interacts with others?

Your child's early years are essential to his or her future learning and development, making it very important to **speak up** if you feel your child is missing developmental milestones or if you have general concerns about his or her development. **Here are steps to take:**

- Talk with your doctor about your concerns and ask for a developmental screening.
- If your doctor does not use a developmental screening tool like the Ages and Stages Questionnaire, you can find it online: tinyurl.com/ASQ-Kids
- Share the results with your child's doctor.
