

Let's define what workshop means:

A small group that meet to explore some subject, develop a skill or technique, carry out a creative project.

One important thing a presenter needs to do to ask what the person requesting the workshop—what do they want the people in the workshop to learn?

What are the reasons management or the Club/ District Executive Committee is asking for a workshop to be about, & what does the club/ district needs to get out of the workshop, Why do members want to attend the workshop?

We will answer some of those questions & give you a little help it what makes a good workshop.



Activities



If at all possible think up an activity to do to make your first point or first group of points after the ice breaker.

Please note this is a little different from giving a speech. When you are giving a speech it is not always possible to hand something out & say to everyone write down you favorite Club project & then talk about each one but if there are 8 to 10 people in a workshop it is possible & doable.

If you can't think of a way to make your first point an activity. Google it!
See if someone has already thought of it. Ask some of your friends or even ask me.

It can be as easy as writing down what the member thinks about what should be in a certain type of report.


Next step—an ice breaker

Just about anything can be a workshop if you have a need to have all your members on the same page about a subject or duty.



Rules for the Workshop



Every workshop has some rules Like;

We will try to be as open as possible about this subject.

Come back from the breaks on time- we won't wait for you.

No eating or drinking, if you are working on computers belonging to someone else.

Or coffee/ tea is okay.

Questions at the end of each section we talk about. Or ask your question as we go.

We will have prizes at the end so stay for the whole workshop.

Be respectful.

We will try hard to stay on task, so allow us to do this.

No cellphones, tablets or e-readers.

The first few minutes

Why are the first 10 minutes so important? First impressions count.

An interesting point, all the attendees are trained to listen. We all learn at school to sit & listen to the teacher. That doesn't last long if you don't offer them something they want.

The first few minutes set the tone for the workshop. We have all been in workshops with someone leading us who isn't ready or bumbles the start. It is very hard for the presenter to get the group back on track.

Outline the reason or purpose for the workshop to start. Short, sweet & simple, "we are all here to learn some tricks for better report writing." Done!

Members are happy because they know what's going on & they feel care for & part of the group. This is very important right now.


