Moments ago, Congress voted to make the biggest cuts to Medicaid in history.

Lawmakers voted to strip away affordable health insurance from millions of people and increase health care costs.

This vote will impact the fight against cancer for years to come. Cancer patients could be kicked off their health insurance and left without access to the treatment they need. Others could have to go without the cancer screenings and preventive care that could save their lives.

ACS CAN advocates like you fought *hard* to oppose these cuts. Even though the result is painful and it might not feel like it right now, I want you to know your efforts mattered. While these cuts are deep and the harm will be significant, we fought off deeper cuts and additional damaging policies that would have put affordable health care even further out of reach. Please hang on to that knowledge: **what you did made a difference.**
