- Students must successfully complete the coursework for which the scholarship is given AND must make their best efforts to work in a business location in Lake County after the degree or certificate program is completed.
- The scholarship monies must be returned to the EDP should the student fail to successfully complete the coursework for which the scholarship is given. • When the student completes their degree or certificate program they will notify the EDP and provide a resume. The EDP will notify businesses who are members of the WWLC Chamber of the student's availability.
- Should a student accept a job outside of Lake County without notifying the EDP of their successful completion of the degree or certificate program, the scholarship monies must be returned to the EDP.

I am Eleanor Ramos, a junior at Riverside High School and Lakeland Community College. I will be graduating with my Associates of Arts in May of 2022, my Associates of Sciences in December of 2022, and my high school diploma in May of 2023. I plan to enter Lakeland Community College's Nursing Program during the fall of 2023, once I turn eighteen years old, to receive my Associates in Nursing and my Registered Nurse Certification. At the same time, I will enter into a dual-enrollment nursing program to receive my Bachelors in Science in Nursing by the age of twenty one years old. I am applying for the Education and Development Program of the Willoughby Western Lake County Chamber of Commerce Scholarship to receive financial support in my nursing career. I am passionate about helping those around me and serving other people, which a career in nursing will provide.

After graduating with my Bachelors in Science in Nursing, I plan to work as a nurse in an intensive care unit, pediatric unit, or NICU. I will use the skills I have learned through clinicals and schooling to provide the best care possible to my patients. I want to ensure that those I am caring for are comfortable, understanding of what is going on with them or their family, and beyond satisfied with the quality of treatment they are receiving.

I have desired to become a nurse since I was a child. It started with my concern for other people and my relationship to the Roman Catholic Church. I knew I wanted to strive to be like Mother Teresa and assist those in need. Moving into the future, when I was fifteen years old, I had a surgery performed at Cleveland Clinic on both of my legs. To repair the damage I experienced, the surgeon and his amazing team broke both of my femurs, tibias, and fibulas. They removed the additional scar tissues and repaired the torn muscles. They implanted titanium rods and screws in my legs to ensure stability. In the process, there was an issue with anesthesia

and the nerve block; neither had worked. The amount of pain I experienced was unbearable. I was scared, confused, disappointed that my long-term career as a gymnast came to an end, and in extraordinary pain. While I was there, there was a nurse named Jo who stayed by my side during the week and a half I was in the hospital. She brushed through my hair, gave me blankets, told me stories about her life as a teenager, explained what was going on, and held my hands as I cried. She created a safe, welcoming, and nurturing environment to a terrified child. I do not recall most of my experience there due to the amount of medication administered and pain, but I do remember my nurse named Jo. I hope that in the future, when I become a nurse, I will be able to provide as much of an impact on someone's life as she did.
