LaGrange County Chamber's Annual Meeting Wraps Up with Inspiring Success and Unified Vision

LaGrange County Chamber of Commerce's Annual Meeting concluded on Thursday, January 11, marking a momentous occasion for the organization and its members. The event, held at the Blue Gate Garden Inn and catered by Shawna Rae's, brought together over 200 dedicated individuals, partners, and community members, fostering a spirit of collaboration and renewed commitment to foster hometown culture and drive exponential success.

Key Highlights of the Annual Meeting Include:

- 1. **Mission Impact**: The organization celebrated significant strides in achieving its mission. Attendees were presented with compelling evidence of the positive impact the LaGrange County Chamber has made over the past year, from next generation workforce development and individual empowerment, to the inaugural ConnectHER Conference and Small Business workshops.
- 2. **Strategic Roadmap**: The Executive Director, Sara Patrick, unveiled a comprehensive strategic roadmap for the upcoming year. Attendees gained insights into the organization's vision, including a few new initiatives, partnerships, and innovative approaches designed to amplify the impact the LaGrange County Chamber can have for its members.
- 3. **Gratitude and Recognition:** A heartfelt acknowledgment was extended to volunteers, partners, and supporters who played pivotal roles in the organization's success. Special recognition was given to the outstanding individuals and entities whose contributions exemplify the spirit of the LaGrange County Chamber through its Legacy Awards. Winners included: Educator of the Year, Brittany Cowley of Lakeland Jr./Sr. High; Member of the Year, Linder's Tavern on Main; Non-Profit of the Year, Elijah Haven Crisis Intervention Center; Professional of the Year, Sherri Johnston of the LaGrange County Economic Development Corporation; Small Business of the Year, Trading Post Outfitters; and Young Professional of the Year, Andrea Howe of Farmers State Bank. Other winners named were Erin Olinger as Chamber Ambassador of the Year, and Andrea Howe as Chamber Director of the Year.
- 4. **Board of Directors Election**: During the annual meeting, the chamber membership was tasked with electing new board of director members. 2 vacancies were left resulting from Dan Byler of LaGwana terming off the board and by Keith James of Indigo Web Services relocating to Southern Indiana. Elected to fill those vacancies were Brittany Sams of LaGrange County REMC and Ben Martin of Lake Country Landscaping. Lauri Couture, representing Farmers State Bank, was reelected to serve her second three-year term.
- 5. **Member Showcase:** Prior to the Annual Meeting, chamber members were given the opportunity to reserve showcase booths. These booths allowed members to highlight their businesses and organizations. This allowed them to interact and network with both members and non-members in attendance. Each year a Member's Showcase booth is selected by an anonymous group of judges to receive a free entry into the next year's Member Showcase. This year the winner of the 2024 Member Showcase was the LaGrange County Community Foundation.

The LaGrange County Chamber's Annual Meeting recap serves as a testament to the organization's resilience, adaptability, and unwavering dedication to positive change. As the Chamber looks towards the future, it does so with a strengthened resolve to make a lasting impact in LaGrange County.
