PROPOSED RULE NUMBER:

BRIEF SUMMARY: In accordance with Public Law Chapter 65, titled “An Act To Amend Maine’s Wildlife Laws Regarding Species of Special Concern” the Department is proposing new rule Chapter 29 to establish criteria for determining when a species of fish or wildlife that is not an endangered species or a threatened species is of special concern. The proposed rule includes criteria for categories of species of special concern, including a category for species that are rare. The commissioner shall use the list, if adopted, in administering 12 MRS, Section 12152 and may also use the list in administering any other laws or programs or when providing advisory recommendations to other entities or agencies on fish and wildlife matters in accordance with applicable laws or rules. PRINCIPAL REASON(S) OR PURPOSE FOR PROPOSING THIS RULE:

Public Law Chapter 65, titled “An Act To Amend Maine’s Wildlife Laws Regarding Species of Special Concern” and enacted by the Governor on May 25, 2021, directs the Department to conduct rulemaking to “establish criteria for determining when a species of fish or wildlife that is not an endangered species or a threatened species is of special concern. The rules may include different criteria for categories of species of special concern, including a category for species that are rare. The rules must list the species that meet the criteria established in rule. The commissioner shall use the list in administering section 12152 and may also use the list in administering any other laws or programs or when providing advisory recommendations to other entities or agencies on fish and wildlife matters in accordance with applicable laws or rules.” Prior to this rulemaking proposal, the list of special concern species had existed only in Department policy and did not include an opportunity for review or input by the public. Incorporating the species of special concern criteria and list of species into a Department rule will increase transparency of the list and provide a formal opportunity for public involvement in species designation.

ANALYSIS AND EXPECTED OPERATION OF THE RULE:

The proposed rule language will be placed in a new rule Chapter 29. The rule creates a specific definition of “species of special concern” and identifies criteria that must be met for a species to be considered for listing as special concern. The rule identifies population guidelines and other factors that will be considered by the Department when recommending listing and identifies a subcategory of rare species that are used by the Department to provide recommendations and advice on land use activities. Finally, the rule includes a list of species of special concern species organized by taxonomic group, including those that are ‘rare’.

BRIEF SUMMARY OF RELEVANT INFORMATION CONSIDERED DURING DEVELOPMENT OF THE RULE
(including up to 3 primary sources relied upon):

Prior to developing the proposed rule, Department staff reviewed Public Law Chapter 65, including testimony related to the bill from the public and advocacy groups. Department staff reviewed and updated the previous 2011 Special Concern list utilizing criteria in the 2014 listing handbook and completed Maine Endangered and Threatened Species Listing Review Work Sheets for each existing and proposed Special Concern species. Several species were removed from the list and incorporated into the State Wildlife Action Plan list of Species of Greatest Conservation Need. Species were added based on recent distribution findings and vulnerability to emerging stressors.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT OF THE RULE: No fiscal impact anticipated.

ADD NEW RULE CHAPTER 29 AS FOLLOWS:

09-137 DEPARTMENT OF INLAND FISHERIES AND WILDLIFE

Chapter 29: SPECIES OF SPECIAL CONCERN

29.01 Scope of Rules

Pursuant to 12 MRSA §10105, sub-§19, the Commissioner has the authority to develop a list of species of special concern, which are any species of fish or wildlife that does not meet the criteria as Endangered or Threatened but is particularly vulnerable, and could easily become an Endangered, Threatened, or Extirpated species due to restricted distribution, low or declining numbers, specialized habitat needs or limits, or other factors. Species of special concern are defined by 12 MRSA

§10001 and used by the Department for planning and informational purposes, including when providing recommendations and advice on land use activities.

29.02 Designation of Species of Special Concern

- A. In determining whether a species meets one or more of the standards for designating a species of special concern, qualifications for consideration, population guidelines, and other factors will be considered. For the purposes of this chapter, "species" will mean "species" or "subspecies" and "populations" will mean all individuals of the species, statewide.

1. Qualifications for Consideration

A species may only be recommended for listing as a state Special Concern species if it meets all of the following qualifications:

- a. It is a species of mammal, bird, fish, amphibian, reptile, or invertebrate wild by nature as distinguished from domestic species;
- b. It is an indigenous species to Maine, meaning it is not an exotic deliberately or accidentally introduced into Maine, the United States, or North America.
- c. It is a species that spends some portion of its annual cycle in Maine, including breeding, migration, or wintering, but is not a vagrant or accidental visitor;
- d. It is a species that has not expanded into Maine within the past 50 years as part of a general range expansion, unless it historically occurred in Maine, is threatened or declining throughout a significant portion of its total range, or other significant risk factors have been identified;
- e. It is a species that has not been reintroduced into Maine as part of an experimental wildlife management program, unless listing is part of the reintroduction plan; and
- f. It is taxonomically classified no finer than a subspecies, unless federally Endangered or Threatened.

2. Population Guidelines

The following population characteristics, when available, will be considered by the Commissioner when determining whether a species meets the definition of a species of special concern in accordance with 12 M.R.S.A. §10001.

- a. Population vulnerability,
- b. Population trend,
- c. Population distribution,
- d. Population fragmentation,
- e. Endemism, meaning the species entirely or largely occurs only in Maine and immediate bordering jurisdictions, and
- f. Regional concern

3. Other Factors

In addition to population guidelines (2) above, other factors, including range or habitat loss, disease, predation, over-utilization, inadequacy of regulations, and other natural or human-related factors as measured through observation, inference, or projection, will be considered when determining whether to include a species on the list of species of special concern.

4. Listing Handbook

The Department shall utilize the “Endangered and Threatened Species Listing Handbook” that will provide scientifically based listing guidelines and criteria based on Sections A-1, 2, and 3 of this rule to guide the listing process.

29.03 Designation of Rare Species of Special Concern

The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall designate a subcategory of species identified as being of special concern that are classified as rare and may be used for advisory recommendations to other entities or agencies on fish and wildlife matters in accordance with applicable laws or rules.

Rare species shall be those Special Concern species that are dependent on specific habitat types or limited breeding locations known to be particularly vulnerable to loss or disturbance; a species that is geographically limited (e.g. < 10 sites in the state); a species identified as vulnerable (NatureServe G3 or higher, IUCN VU or higher); or that qualifies for MESA status.
