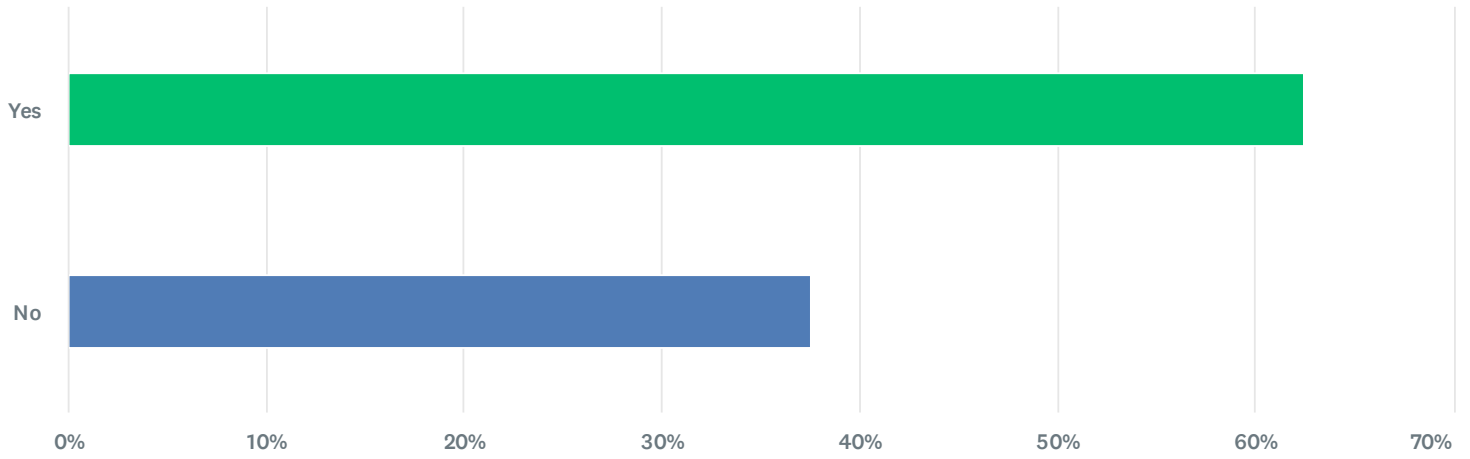

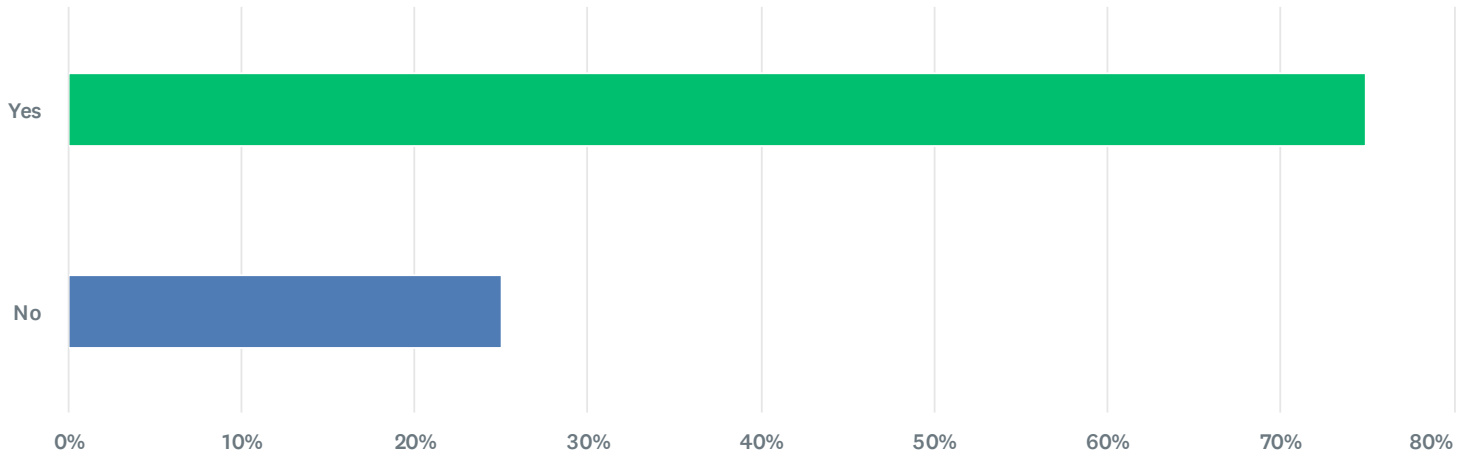

2	· Chaperones for breast and GU exams documentation – According to GA medical board, providers are required to have a chaperone present for any breast/GU exam (sensitive physical exam) for any patient of the opposite sex. For all other examinations, best practice is to make patients aware that they may have a chaperone present if desired. This chaperone can be a staff member or a parent.
