
REV. DR. NATALIE FENIMORE

A Harvest at the Equinox

On Sunday, September 21, celebrate the Autumnal Equinox by bringing non-perishable food items to surround our Labyrinth. The Social Justice Committee will collect food items to re-stock our own food pantry and distribute other goods to food pantries in Nassau County. (And we'd love to get a great picture, so your

contributions will help mark our congregation's generosity.)

The Equinox is celebrated in Celtic traditions as the second of three harvest festivals. We marked First Fruits in early August and will celebrate Halloween at the end of the harvest season. But this will be a morning to bring gifts and to walk the Labyrinth if one chooses. (There will be people on hand to help people walk if one feels unsteady.) Our Religious Education Program will then use the Labyrinth during their Water Ingathering.

The Labyrinth will be set up early on Sunday morning. Food contributions will be accepted throughout the day. A formal "opening" of the labyrinth will happen at 10:00 AM, and a ritual closing will occur at 3:00 PM.

Hi fellow congregants and friends! I am writing on behalf of the Respectful Relationships Team (RRT), made up of Paul Carbone, Rev. David, and me. RRT was created to help our congregation live into our covenant through compassionate communication and respectful relationships. We look forward to soon inviting new members to join our team and expand what RRT can accomplish.

This past congregational year, you got to know RRT through our workshops and presence in the *Quest*. We held our first workshop, "Understanding Empathy" in February. We viewed a video together and discussed our fears, strengths, resources, and personal practices that support us. We began to develop a language around empathy to carry us through the next year. The February 23 Worship Service introduced the RRT to the congregation.

Open to all, whatever your religious background, we provide fun, engaging structured learning and spiritual experiences appropriate to children's developmental stages and interests, grounded in the values represented by the Values and Inspirations of the Unitarian Universalist Association and the Covenant of this congregation. This is a community where questioning and curiosity are welcome, kindness is nourished, and opportunities for service to those in need are provided.

The theme for this year in Religious Education is the Unitarian Universalist Shared Value of GENEROSITY. We will go on a journey to explore how we can be spiritually generous to ourselves, extend generosity to everyone we know, and globally expand and inspire a culture of generosity throughout the wider world. These discoveries and more will be infused throughout the classroom experiences and processed in depth between all ages in Children's and Youth Worship in the Chapel led by Lifespan Religious Education Coordinator Carson Jones and RE Music Specialist George Weisman. Shinnecock Kelp Farmers

The first indigenous-owned kelp farm is now located on the East Coast and has been formed by Shinnecock women. For them, and their Shinnecock community, it is more than a crop. This is the plant that is fighting the nitrogen pollution that is destroying Shinnecock Bay. Outdated water waste systems are the main cause. In 2024, Suffolk County passed a ballot to modernize old wastewater infrastructure.

In 2020, a nonprofit Shinnecock Kelp Farmers became stewards of these waters, part of their ancestral lands. To combat the algae, they modernized its solutions with science and technology. To harvest kelp from the waters, farmers and helpers, including the Sisters of Saint Joseph, friends, and concerned people who live on Long Island assisted. This harvested kelp must dry out on land before being used as a natural fertilizer. Combining the traditional knowledge of how seaweed grows with new science has helped the Shinnecock people while protecting Long Island from nitrogen killing pollution of their waters and other marine life.






