Slow down, you move too fast. Got to make the morning last...I'm dappled and drowsy and ready to sleep. Let the morningtime drop all its petals on me. Life, I love you, all is groovy (excerpts from The 59th St Bridge Song, by Simon and Garfunkel).

As we enter the winter holiday season, many of us find ourselves swept up in a whirlwind of activities: shopping, decorating, cooking, attending

gatherings, and checking off endless to-do lists. The irony is that during a time meant for celebration and connection, we often feel most rushed and disconnected. Yet this is precisely when we most need to slow down and cultivate presence, for it's only in stillness that we can truly experience gratitude. We cannot be grateful for what we're racing past without noticing.

Each morning, I engage in a spiritual practice that I call "coffee meditation." This is my special time of day when I pause to clear my mind and get grounded for the day. I always wanted to be someone who meditated but found it difficult to make it a regular practice until I figured out how to build it into my daily routine.

The secret was linking meditation to something I already loved and did every day: my morning coffee. Now, as the coffee brews, I sit quietly, following my breath and letting thoughts drift by like clouds. The familiar ritual of preparing coffee becomes a gentle anchor, calling me back to the present moment.

What I've discovered is that this simple act of pausing transforms my entire day. In those few minutes of stillness, I'm not planning, worrying, or rehearsing. I'm just here, noticing the warmth of the mug in my hands, the aroma filling the room, the quiet before the day begins. This practice reminds me that presence isn't something we achieve—it's something we return to, again and again.

We live in a culture that glorifies busyness and constant productivity. But there's profound spiritual wisdom in deliberately slowing down.

Bring coats to the collection bins in the UUCSR Main Lobby from Sunday, November 16–Sunday, November 30.



Pilgrimage To Romania

Four hundred years ago, a liberal religious movement arose in Eastern Europe that celebrated religious tolerance and freedom of belief. That movement is Unitarianism, and it is centered in Transylvania, the Hungarian-speaking region of Romania. A visit to historical sites and our partner church will help us understand the deep historical roots of our shared faith.

Since the early 1990s, UUCSR has partnered with the Unitarian Church in Csikszereda (Miercurea Ciuc in Romanian), Transylvania. We helped to finance the construction of their new worship hall, and UUCSR members visited there for its opening. Members of their congregation have reciprocated with visits. Through the ongoing George Kesner Memorial Book Exchange in the Social Hall and the annual Partner Church Auction, we have been able to continue assisting our partner church financially. The DAC blog on the UUCSR website has an essay on the history of our relationship. Read about it HERE.

A trip to the region might also include a visit to the Janos Zsigmond Unitarian High School in the city of Kolozsvar (Cluj-Napoca in Romanian). This past spring, the choir of that high school performed a concert at UUCSR to much acclaim.

Why Plants Hold Onto Their Leaves

Autumn is well underway and trees are nearing the end of leaf drop; take time to observe which deciduous plants are dropping their leaves and which are stubbornly holding on. These persistent leaves are marcescent, ones that delay their leaf drop into spring; these include oaks, beeches, hornbeams, and witch hazels. These leaves will brown and wither, however, will remain attached by their petiole.

There are several hypotheses why marcescence occurs: to provide animal cover during cold months, to prevent animal browsing by covering young leaf and flower buds, to allow snow accumulation on the leaves and in turn provide additional hydration, or to delay leaf mulch accumulation into spring when new growth will need it the most.

On the other hand, many introduced species also hold onto their leaves, usually staying green into the winter. In turn, allowing these plants to photosynthesize longer than our native species, this permits them to grow when natives have become dormant and expand their hold in soil. Some examples are Norway maple, winged euonymus, multiflora rose, bittersweet, and wineberry.

Next time you go outside, observe which deciduous plants are still holding onto their leaves; are they native and marcescent or introduced to our region? These photos are both from the UUCSR forest, which is a better representative of a native community?




