
Meik Wiking, executive director of the Copenhagen Institute for Happiness, graduated in Political Science, worked for the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and for seven years for the think tank Monday Morning, studying sustainability in the green economy . But in 2012 he was struck by a UN-approved resolution calling on European countries to incorporate * parameters of quality of life and happiness to measure progress *. Aware that Denmark led the world's happiest ranking, the 33-year-old Institute of Happiness Research decided: "Since then, my career and my job have been to find out three things: * how to measure happiness, why People are happier than others, and how to improve the quality of life. "As much as they tell us that happiness comes from within, in this part of the world, living in one of the Nordic welfare states, help: Free access to health, university, equality between men and women, good pensions .. "It's not like we're dancing in the streets," Wiking says. "If, for example, I lost my job, I could continue to maintain a relatively high standard of living. I do not think there's anyone in Denmark who can not sleep thinking their kids are not

going to college. Compared with the United States of Anxiety, we are very happy: we do not have to compete since infants. That people can have a good life, choose the profession of their choice, it is an advantage on many levels, it even reduces the crime rate, since there is not much to fight about. But we can always learn from other countries, and that's why I run the world through my surveys. "

Measuring happiness is not a simple matter, the Happiness Research Institute uses the OECD recommendations, including a life that makes sense: "We follow large groups of people over decades and see what the facts are that influence their happiness or unhappiness (one of them is the loss of work). With us work economists, philosophers, sociologists, anthropologists, psychologists, political scientists. We are a think tank that we are between the academic and political world, and between society and companies. * If we know that egalitarian societies are happier, why do not we turn that into concrete policies? If people make them unhappy to invest a lot of time in commuting, they are happier if they are walking or cycling, why do not we prioritize it in the design of cities and labor

flexibility? The Times rated him as the happiest man in the world ... "I do not know if it's true, but maybe he's among the finalists," he says with a laugh. The last of his books, Hygge, Happiness in Little Things, edited in Spanish by Dome Books, has been translated into 25 languages. The word hygge means well-being, and the Danish conjugate it in a thousand ways, can be verb and adjective, and use it constantly. They want a hyggelig day and when they get cold in the feet they put on a hyggesokker of good wool. It is a lot of the art of creating intimacy, the comfort of the soul, the pleasure of the presence of comforting things, of the welcoming union.

Mobile Phone

Telia has one of the best pricing plans on the market for phone deals with a lot of data. With Telia Talk you can buy packages of 1, 3 or 10 GB data. You'll have one week, one month or three months to use the data, and the packages cost 49, 99 and 299 Danish kroner.

The rest of the Danish providers offer many different deals. Sometimes you won't be able to get 3G or 4G access. Often you'll only pay for the first 5-10 MB of usage each day, but there'll be a limit each day for the data usage.

At TDC you'll pay 1,99 kroner per MB but never higher than 9 kroner each day. When you have used 50 MB for one day, you won't be able to use any more data that day.

Lebara also offers packages with 2-4 GB data – they also have a lot of hours included (10-14 hours), but even if you don't need the hours they could be a good option. The hours included can even be used to call 42 countries, so if you need to call your home country for longer conversations they might be a very suitable deal for you. You'll be able to buy prepaid deals at many shops – both electronic shops and supermarkets. Some of the providers also have their own shops in the bigger Danish cities, e.g. Copenhagen, Aarhus, Aalborg and Odense.

Airport


Airport to Hotels- Copenhagen Airport - CPH to AC Hotel Bella Sky

Public Transit

The City Pass gives you unlimited access to buses, trains, metro and harbour buses in zones 1 - 4, which includes the centre of Copenhagen and to and from the airport.

- **Citypass**

With a City Pass you can enjoy unlimited travel on buses, trains and the metro in Copenhagen in zones 1-4, from the moment you arrive in Copenhagen via the airport. You can buy the tickets upon arrival in the airport or in advance so you can travel easily from and to the airport without having to think about where to purchase tickets, the types of tickets available or travel zones.

24 hours City Pass (Adult: 80 DKK - Child: 40 DKK)

72 hours City Pass (Adult: 200 DKK - Child: 100 DKK)




