S. 3651 - "SPECIAL OPERATORS PROTECTION ACT"

H.R. 7136 - "SPECIAL OPERATORS PROTECTION ACT"

The Problem: Special Operators and their families face grave danger at home.

- Terrorists and hostile nations have threatened harm to special ops personnel and their families in the US. An Iranian-linked hacker group, Handala, doxed personal information of 2,379 US Marines and 400 US Navy officers in the Middle East.
- In January 2026 when Maduro was captured in Venezuela, the SF team leader was doxed by the media, and the local sheriff had to protect the SF leader's family and his home.
- Public records list personal details, such as home address, leaving personnel, their spouses and children exposed to danger, harassment, and physical tracking ("doxing").

What the Special Operators Protection Act proposes:

- Federal Criminal Penalties for doxing
- Enhanced Sentencing if death or serious bodily injury occurs
- Protects Special Forces, SEALs, Marine Raiders, and others on sensitive missions
- Protects Personally Identifiable Data

The bipartisan **Special Operators Protection Act** aims to prevent the exposure and targeting of elite military personnel and other sensitive defense personnel who conduct high-profile national security operations and make it a federal crime to publicly share (dox) identifying information with the intent to threaten, intimidate, or incite violence against them.

- Your name and if you are a constituent
- The bill or issue are you calling about and your position on the bill (for or against)
- Request that the member will support/pass the bill, or oppose it
- Staffers keep a record of the number of callers on a bill and the action the callers request
- Staffers are busy and rarely want to discuss the merits of the bill
- Leaving a voice mail message with the basic information is equally valid and counts
- Always thank them for considering your request
