ORDER

This Order addresses Defendants' Motion to Stay Litigation Pending the Supreme Court's Decision in Axon Enterprise, Inc. v. Federal Trade Commission, No. 21-86 (Jan. 24, 2022) [ECF Nos. 19, 20], Plaintiffs' Response to Defendants' Motion to Stay Litigation [ECF No. 25], Plaintiffs' Memorandum in Support of a Stay of Both Proceedings or No Stay at All [ECF No. 26], Defendants' Supplemental Briefing Opposing a Stay of the Underlying FERC Proceeding [ECF No. 28], Plaintiffs' Letter Brief [ECF No. 30], and Plaintiffs' Supplemental Brief in Support of a Stay of Both Proceedings or No Stay at All [ECF No. 32]. The parties have advised the Court that two cases arising out of substantially similar facts are pending before the Supreme Court of the United States. On May 20, 2022, the Court held a hearing pursuant to the parties' request and the parties are unopposed to staying both this case and the underlying Federal Energy Regulatory Commission proceeding ("FERC proceeding"). Accordingly, this case is STAYED pending resolution of Axon Enterprise, Inc. v. Federal Trade Commission, Case No. 21-86 and Cochran v. U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission, Case No. 21-1239, in the Supreme Court of the United States, and is ADMINISTRATIVELY CLOSED without prejudice to it being reopened upon a motion by any party or to enter a judgment. Further, the FERC proceeding is STAYED under 5 U.S.C. § 705 without prejudice to it being reopened upon a motion by any party.
