

This Week's Answers:

1. **b)** The Our Father is the only prayer that Jesus himself taught his disciples (Mt 6: -9-13; Lk 11:2-4). That is why the Our Father is also called “the Lord’s Prayer”.
2. **b)** Upon learning that the Syrians had surrounded and attacked, Dothan, the town in which he was staying, Elisha prayed to God to strike them blind so that he can lead them away. He led them to Samaria. As soon as the Syrian army entered Samaria, he prayed to the Lord to let them see once again. Filled with compassion, Elisha requested that the Syrian army not be put to death, but to be provided with food and drink and to be returned to their king. (2 Kings 6: 18-23)
3. **a)** As Hannah prayed to the Lord for a son, Eli thought she was drunk when he noticed that her lips were moving but made no sound. (1 Samuel 1: 9-14)
4. **d)** This is known as The Transfiguration. (Luke 9: 29)
