

This week's answers:

1. **a)** The word *evangelist* comes from a Greek word that means “one who announces the good news.” The four evangelists, or Gospel writers, are Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.
2. **a)** *Gentile* is the word for anyone who is not a Jew. It was used this way in our Lord’s time, and it is still used this way today.
3. **d)** From the time when the Jews wandered in the desert until the fall of Jerusalem, the ark of the covenant was honored. After that, it disappeared, but legend says that the prophet Jeremiah hid it on Mt. Nebo. See 2 Maccabees 2:4-8
4. **d)** Genesis tells the stories of Adam and Eve, Noah, Abraham, and Jacob and his twelve sons.
5. **b)** Jesus is the Latin form of the Greek translation of the Hebrew name Joshua. It means "God saves."
