1. **a)** St. Jerome (347-420 AD) gave us the first Latin Bible translation, known as The Vulgate. He is the patron of librarians. His feast day is September 26.
2. **d)** Moses appointed Joshua as his successor to lead the Israelites into the Promised Land (Deuteronomy 31:7).
3. **c)** St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582 AD) wrote The Interior Castle, describing how to grow closer to God through contemplative prayer. Her feast day is October 15.
4. **d)** St. Pius X (1835-1914 AD) moved the reception of First Communion to the age of reason, approximately second grade in the United States. Known as the Pope of the Blessed Sacrament, and patron of first communicants, August 21 is his feast day.
5. **d)** St. Catherine had mystical visions of Jesus and is a doctor of the Church. She is a patron saint of Italy with a feast day of April 29.
