

This week's answers:

1. **b)** In Matthew's version of this parable (18:10-14), "Jesus recalled that God's love excludes on one..." "There is not, never has been, and never will be a single human being for whom Christ did not suffer" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, n. 605).
2. **a)** Celebrated in the East since the sixth century (the seventh century in Rome), the roots of the feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary are attributed to the Apostle James' account of the life of Christ.
3. **d)** See Revelation 12:7. Also see Tobit 12:15 (Raphael) and Luke 1:19 (Gabriel). Pope John Paul II asked all Catholics to pray to St. Michael the Archangel daily to fight evil in the world.
4. **True.** All three of these great monotheistic religions share the faith of Abraham that professes that the one God is both the creator and the final judge (CCC, nos. 839, 841)
5. **c)** Besides being beautiful works of art, stained glass windows were used as an effective and creative tool for catechesis. Art, music, movies, theater, and the internet are creatively used today to teach the faith.
