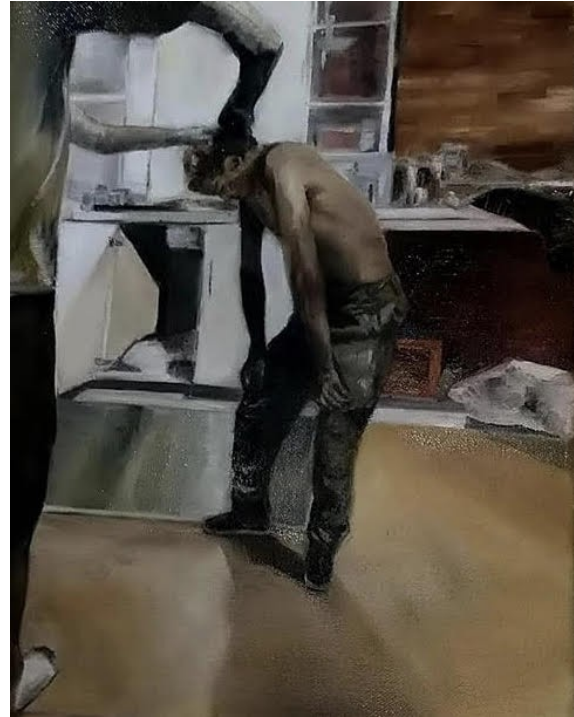


**2021 REQUIREMENTS for

The Naomi Rabb Winston Scholarship in Two-Dimensional Art is an annual scholarship in honor of the late Naomi Rabb Winston who endowed the Winston Scholarships, and is available through the National Society of Arts and Letters to visual artists ages 16 to 22, divided into two age categories 16-18 and 19-22.

Frank Wright (1932-2020), was a local artist and professor, at George Washington University. He was born in NE Washington DC, attended Eastern High School and was able to study art at American University with an award from NSAL! A member of NSAL-DC's Advisory Council and past Judge of Winston Art, his family, friends and members of NSAL-DC have generously given towards the Frank Wright Award. Also divided into the two age categories.

- Applicants must demonstrate exceptional talent and promise of future success.
- The scholarship funds are for private study, special training or personal advancement in the applicants' chosen art fields. The funds can be used for college tuition and required art supplies, but not for housing, travel or personal expenses.
- Scholarship funds are sent to the institution, teacher or program selected by the scholarship recipient. Scholarship recipients have 15 months to use the funds.
- Scholarship recipients may reapply as often as their age allows and are eligible to participate in other NSAL competitions.
- Frank Wright Awards will be monetary Awards with no restrictions, available only to applicants to the NSAL-DC Chapter.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicant must:

1. Be a citizen of the United States. A copy of birth certificate, passport, or naturalization papers must be submitted with application.
2. Be at least 16 years old, but not older than 22 by March 1, 2021.

ARTISTIC REQUIREMENTS

1. The art works must be original and created by traditional methods. Photographs, computer generated imager or computer digital painting and three-dimensional works are "not" permitted.
2. The style of work may be realistic, abstract or expressive.

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICANTS TO THE WASHINGTON DC CHAPTER (incl. Md & Nthn Va)

1. The following should be posted to a Google Drive Folder and a shareable link should be sent by Monday, February 1st, 2021, to nsalcelia.josephs@gmail.com: a completed 2 page Application Form, a copy of the applicant's US birth certificate, current US passport or naturalization certificate and images of 5 examples of the applicant's artwork (high resolution jpeg) Each image must be labeled with the artist's name, title and the medium of the artwork. Note the application must show the title, the dimensions of the work and the date it was completed.
2. Works must be two-dimensional and may be on paper, canvas, masonite, metal or wood panels. Mediums may include pencil, pen, charcoal, colored pencil, watercolor, gouache, tempera, encaustic, acrylic, mixed media and original prints created by the printmaking processes.

ADJUDICATION

1. Qualified judges will be given copies of the age and brief bio of each artist and how they want to use their scholarships.
2. NSAL-DC judges will select the artwork one/ two applicants as winners and up to seven Highly Commended applicants.

PROTECTION

1. Care and caution must be exercised in the handling of all flash drives (NSAL-DC winners only to provide when informed).
2. The National Scholarship Committee and NSAL-DC reserves the right to reproduce in color or in black and white, the flash drives of the art submitted by the finalists. The reproduction will be used for educational and/or publicity purposes only.

DEADLINES

1. Contestant applications are due to the NSAL Chapter nearest their homes or schools by February 1, 2021. For Chapter addresses, other than Washington DC, contact executivedirector@arts-nsal.org Winners to mail flash drive with art works by Feb 20, 2021 to Celia Josephs at 6820 Wisconsin Avenue, #8012, Chevy Chase MD 20815.
2. Naomi Rabb Winston Art/ Frank Wright Award winners will be announced the first week in April 2021.
