



The Canadian Floor Cleaning & Restoration Association (CFCRA) is proud to host three NAFCT courses in Toronto in late January and early February:

***Wood Floor Maintenance Technician (WFMT): January 31-February 1 2017**

In this course you will learn about the procedures, equipment and materials required to do wood floor maintenance, including chemicals, supplies (equipment, tools and materials) and commonly accepted service methodologies. You will be taught basic information concerning the materials used to manufacture wood flooring and how it impacts on-site performance and maintenance procedures.

***Introduction to Substrate and Subfloor Inspection (ISSI): January 30-31 2017**

This course is an introductory, prerequisite course created to teach a basic understanding of substrates and subfloors as they relate to finish floor coverings. This course was developed especially for individuals engaged in inspecting, installing, creating and/or interpreting specifications.

***Resilient Floor Inspector (RFI): February 1-4 2017**

(Prerequisite: IICRC Certification in SSI or ISSI) This course is intended to teach a basic understanding of resilient floorcovering inspection. It was developed especially for individuals engaged in inspecting, installing, creating and/or interpreting specifications. Emphasis is placed on teaching participants an overview of the characteristics of resilient floorcovering.

**For those interested in obtaining IICRC certification, an IICRC certification exam will be administered at the conclusion of these training classes.*
