Move-in day was an adventure. Moving more than 20 children and their belongings required a lot of help and muscle. You can see in the pictures some of their challenging journey through rained out streets and up their nearly impassible driveway.



For the Grace family, their new home is much more than a larger space. There is much adversity going on around them: war, difficult weather, and uncertainty. Their new home brings hope to the children of Grace's Home. The fresh paint, ample living area, spaces to call their own, and a yard to run and play in are good for their health and







mindset. This new beginning is possible because of the continual contributions from our friends. Thank you!

(BCA) Cahes SHARING HIS PROMISE OF HOPE

Bringing children hope comes in many forms. Sometimes it can be through tangible items such as food, clothing, and schoolbooks. Sometimes it is a safe, secure home setting. As Christians, we have the duty of not only showing the love of God to children, but also encouraging others to do the same. BCH CARES is a trauma training program available to churches, foster parents, schools, healthcare workers, and others who want to learn more about helping children who have had traumatic experiences.



"I'm excited for our new training to launch in January." said Chrislin Knight, BCH Training and Outreach Coordinator. Chrislin joined BCH in the summer of 2023 with a background in psychology and teaching. She sees

this as an opportunity to use both these skills to serve God by training others. Chrislin said, "Our new program has been written in-house from a Christian perspective. There are so many examples of trauma in the Bible. BCH Cares approaches trauma training by employing the words of our Creator and Healer."

Trauma-Informed Care training will focus on causes of trauma, effects of trauma on child development, symptoms of trauma, responses that are supportive, and recommendations to avoid burnout in caregivers.



"When we were creating the training, it was important to ensure the training did not limit us to just exploring trauma and its effect on the brain, body, and overall wellbeing. BCH's Cares Trauma Training goes beyond just

comprehension of trauma; we connect biblical application with an understanding of trauma. Attendees will develop response skills to better support those impacted by trauma, become empowered through God's love for a hurting world and His promise of hope through Him, and share how to become advocates for trauma awareness. You will walk away from the training with not just an understanding on trauma, but you will also learn and explore how you can use this knowledge to better serve God's children," Faith Evers, BCH Training Coordinator.

There are several trainers preparing for this ministry. Training will be available in-person and virtually.
