IDEA and Section 504 eligible students are still eligible inside, so they have a right to IEP services they did not receive during this time, per their annual goals and compensatory ed.

We are seeing in the adult side that prisoners with disabilities are sometimes not included in COVID release programs because they need more support. That can be illegal, its wrong, and we want to make sure that folks know to look out for it.
