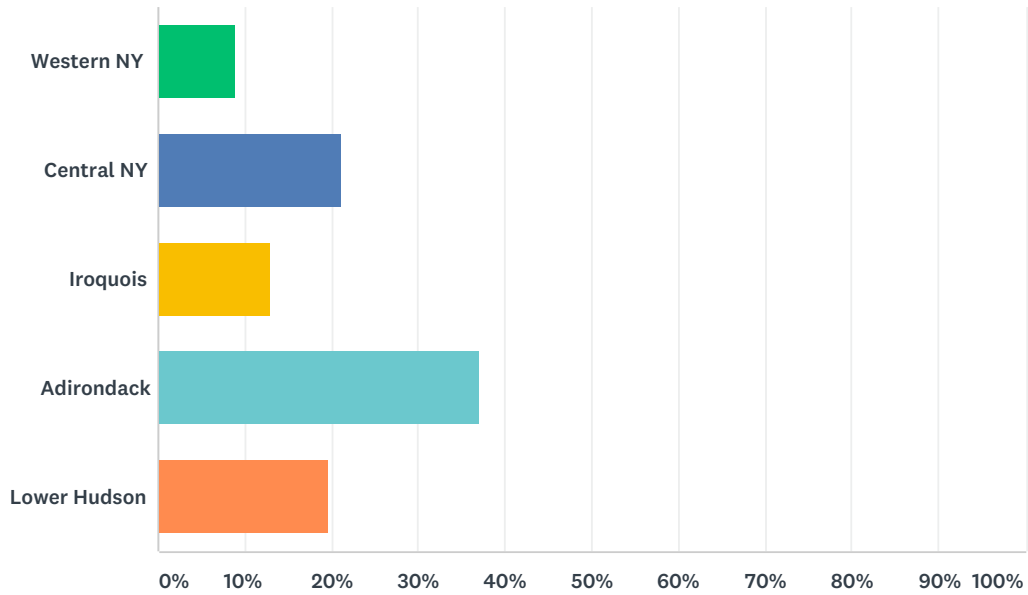


Q1 As defined by the boundaries of NYSAF Chapters, what geographic area are you located in (see <http://www.newyorksaf.org/#about>):

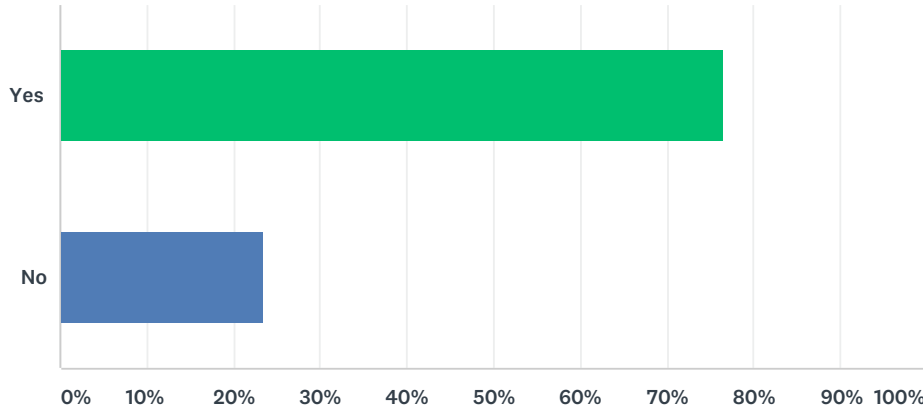

Q2 Do you or have you ever been involved in development of a 480-a plan or the management of property under 480-a?

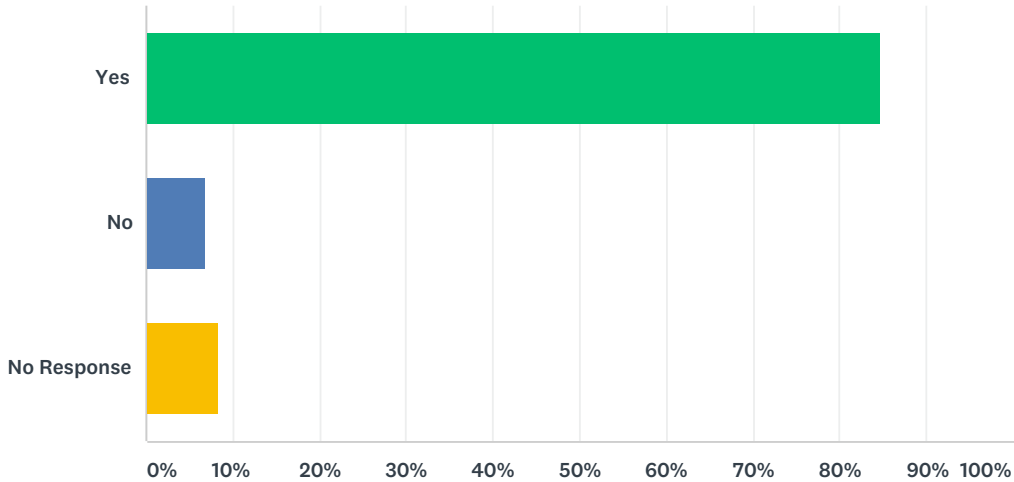

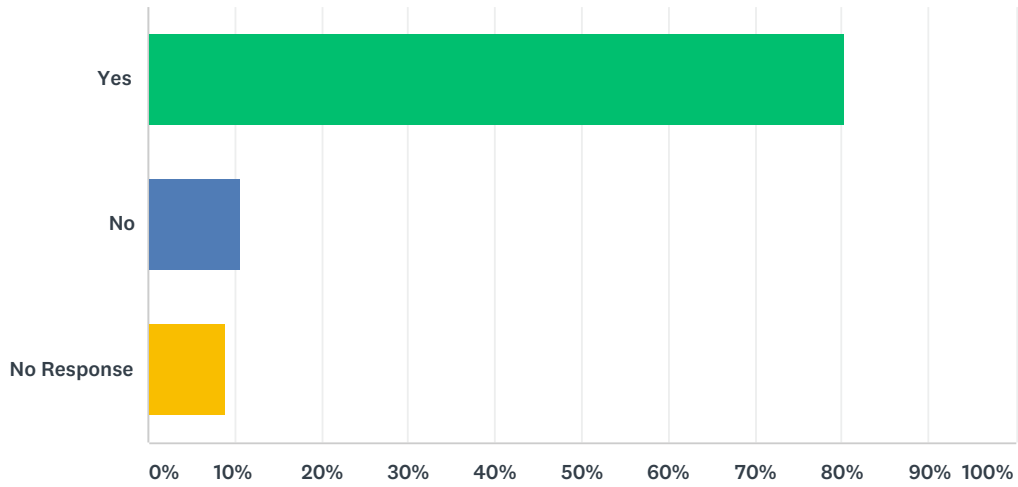

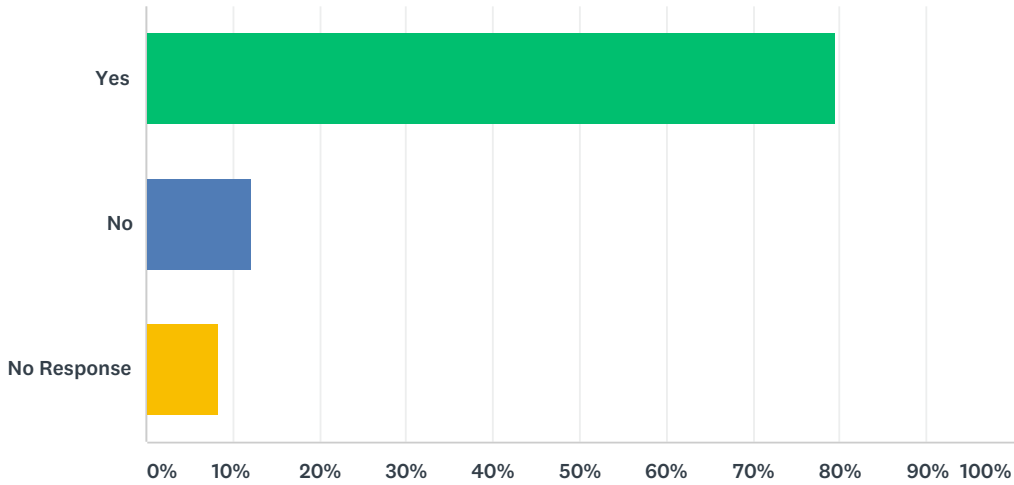

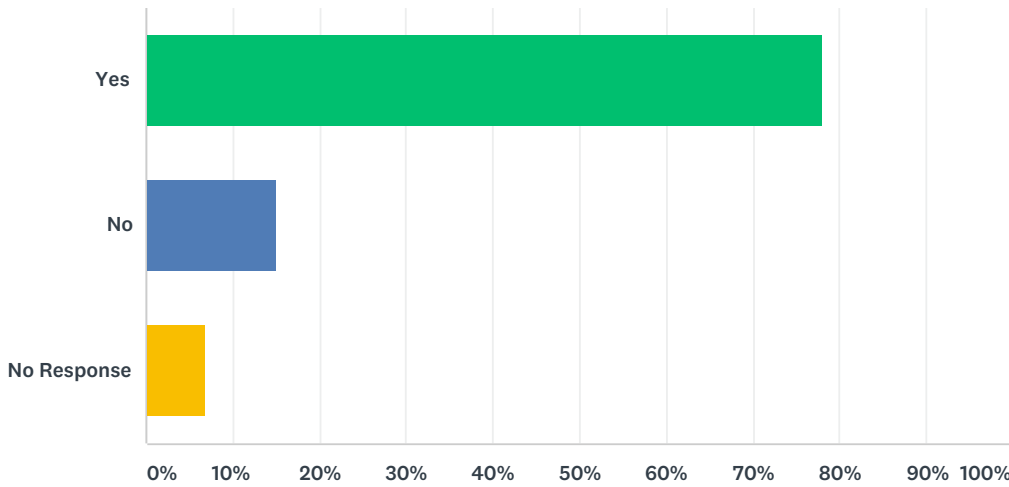

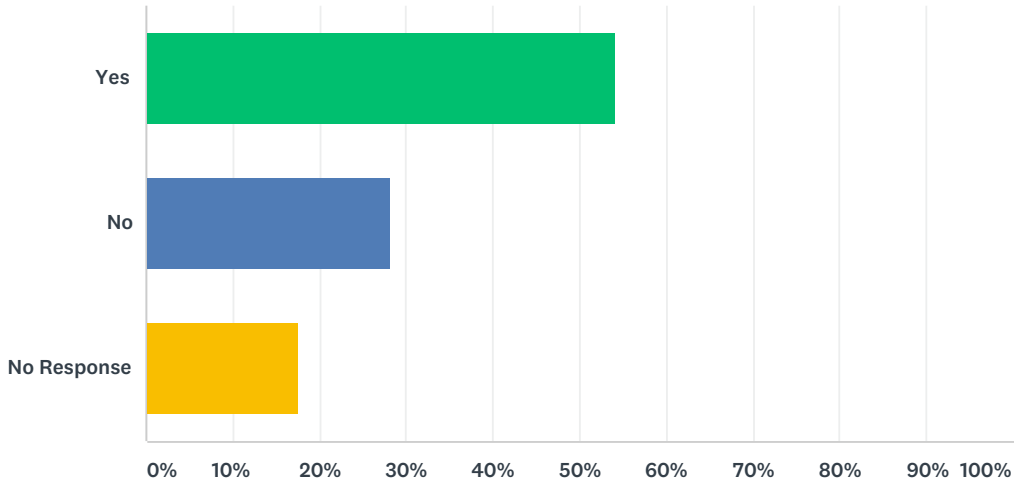

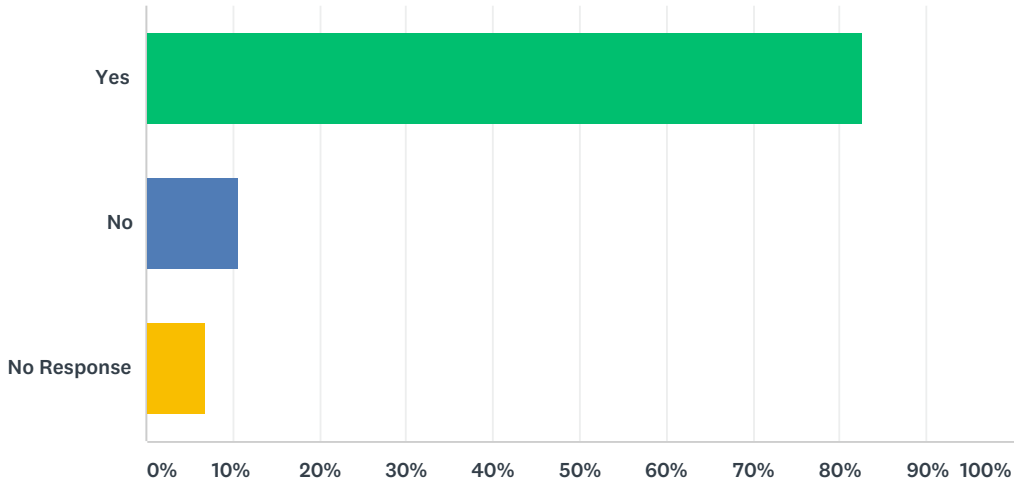

Q8 Would you support the replacement of the required 15-year work schedule with a 10-year work window, allowing for work to occur anytime during the 10-year work window?

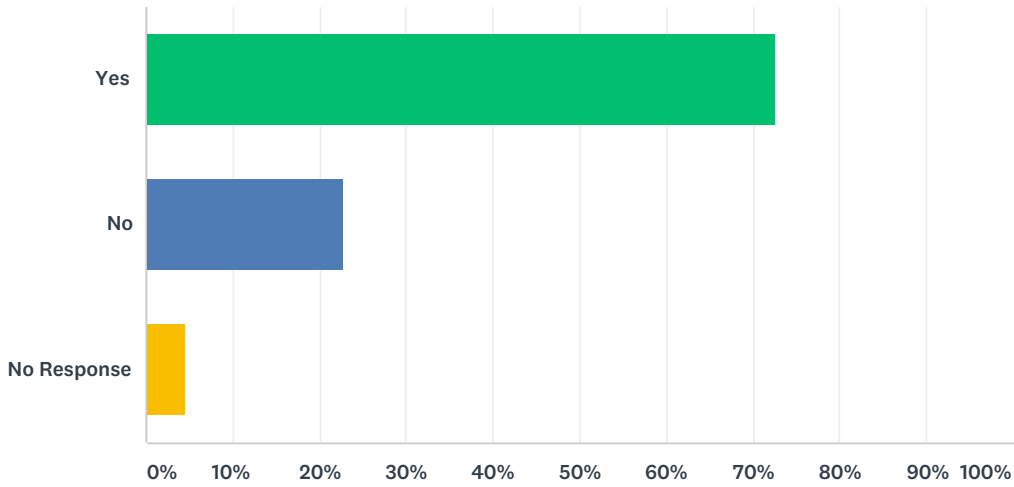

Q9 Would you support the replacement of the required 5-year update of the forest management plan with a 10-year update interval?

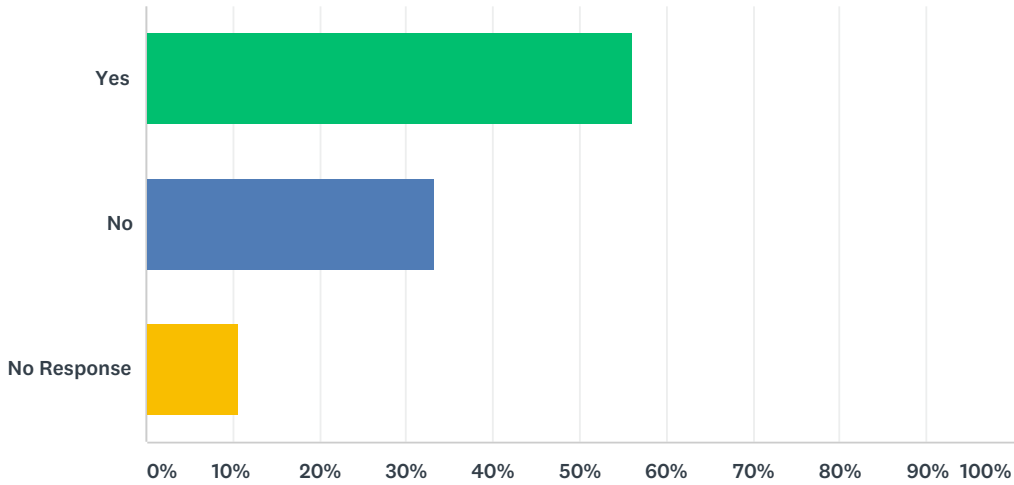

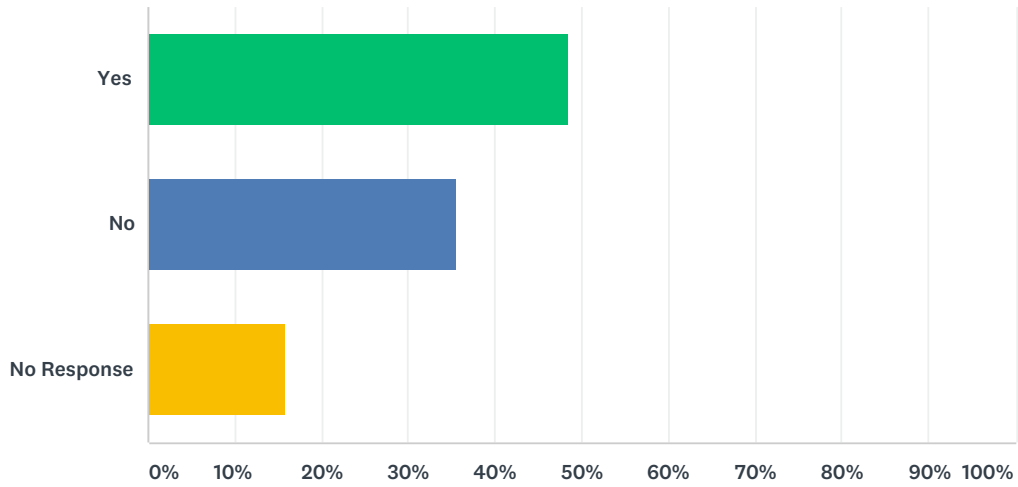

Q11 Are in you favor of setting submission deadlines of at least six month prior to taxable status date for submitting new plans?

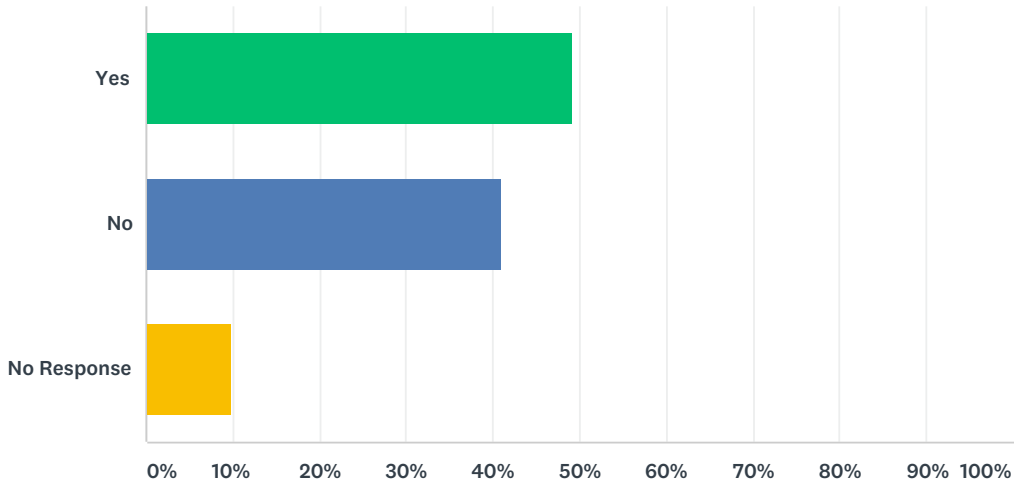

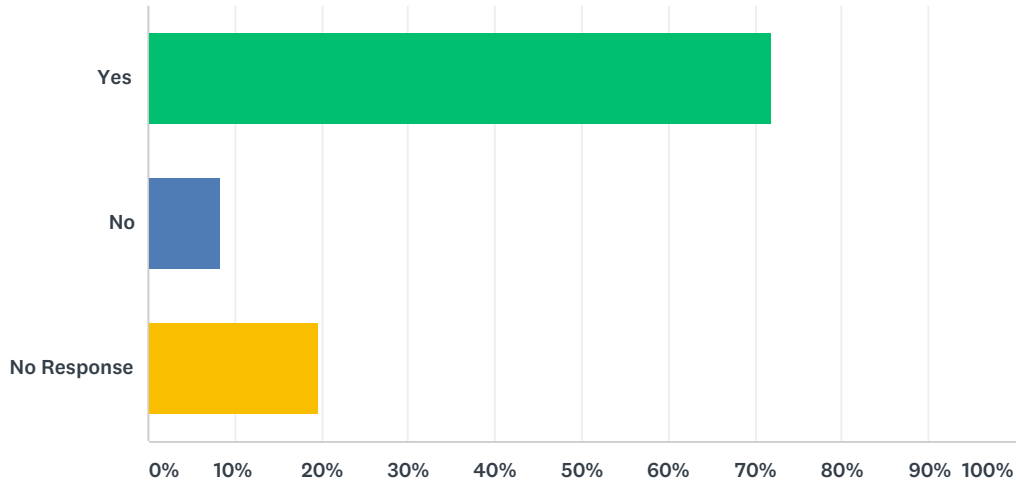
