What's new since the Pandemic –</b> <b>Anthony Lammono</b>, NYSDEC Pesticides; <b>Mark Whitmore</b>, Forest entomologist, Dept. of Natural Resources and the Environment, Cornell University; <b>Frank Buccello</b>, Spotted Lantern Fly Survey Program Supervisor; NYS Department of Agriculture &amp; Markets; and <b>Kelsey McLaughlin</b>, Research Scientist 1, Forest Health Diagnostic Lab, Bureau of Invasive Species and Ecosystem Health NYSDEC. <b>Moderator Mark Keister</b>. Speakers will cover topics such as new legislation regarding pesticide use, Hemlock Woolly Adelgid, Elm Zig Zag Sawfly, Beech Leaf Disease, Beech leaf mining weevil, Spotted Lanternfly, Gypsy moth, oak wilt biology, and techniques to control interfering Beech regeneration. Each of these subjects will be discussed in depth with several photographs of symptoms and the variation over time and among affected species of host and agents involved. The attendee should exit the classroom with a detailed understanding of these agents, how to detect them, interpret their damage and provide a prescription for intervention.
