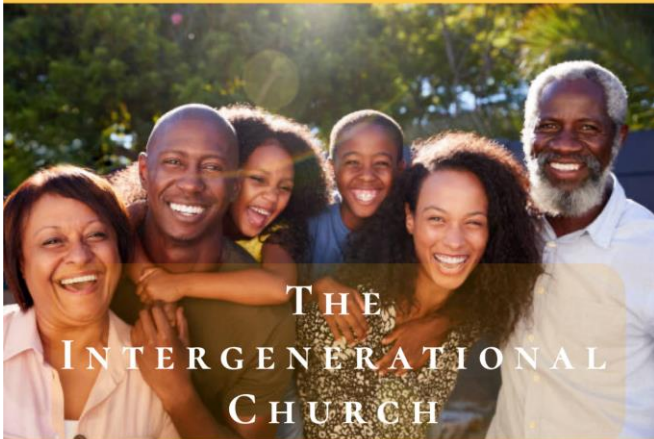
WHERE IS TRINITY CHURCH GOING?

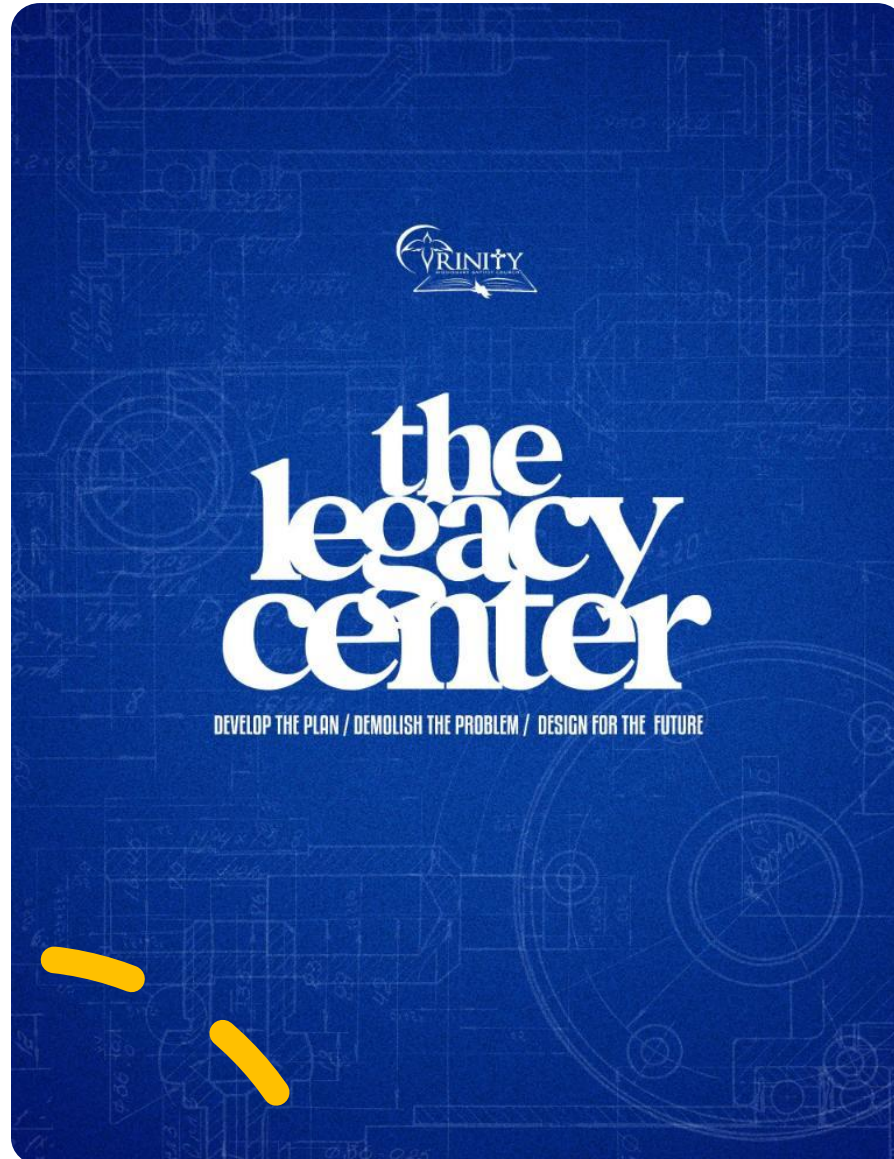

- Traditional and contemporary music in our worship experiences
- Traditional ministries and new ministries operating side-by-side
- Changing terminology
- A transitional atmosphere
- Diminishing tension over the philosophy of ministry

Our goal is to blend the contemporary and traditional in hopes of glorifying God and ministering to all generations so that they all remain and engaged in church. I am asking the lay leadership of our church to take ownership of this corporate initiative. I pray that our commitment to disciple-making causes us to see the need and opportunities available in a blended church. Prayerfully, lay leaders will contribute solutions in a long-term plan to bring the generations together. Furthermore, making a solid commitment to outreach and assimilation, while also extinguishing fire-like criticism from members who feel that they are being neglected. 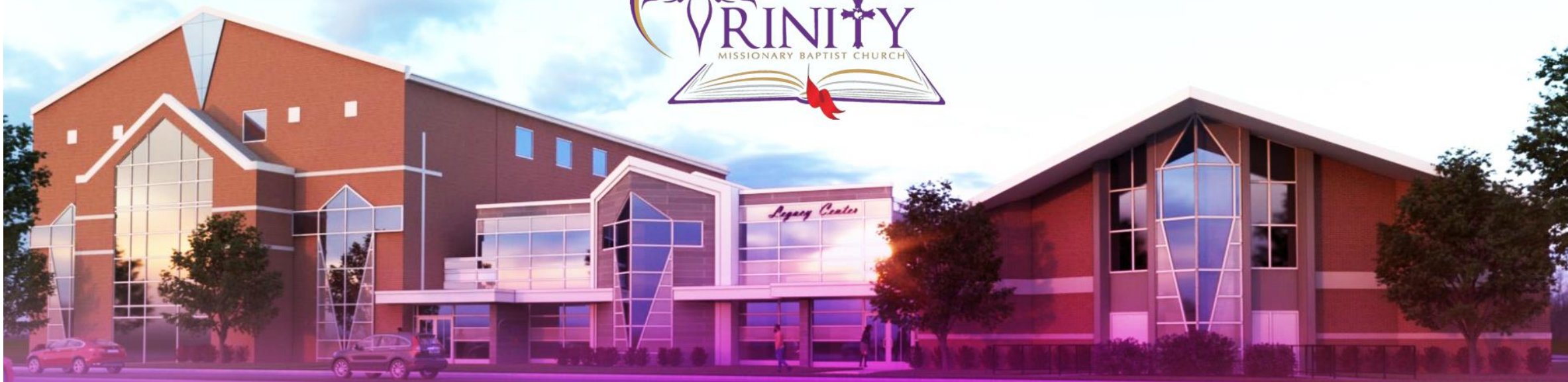

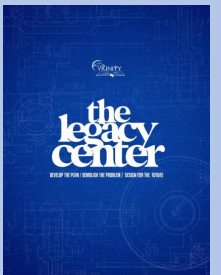

- Current:
 - Molded basement (increasing water damage), with declining air quality
 - Currently have 10 educational spaces on 3 floors
 - Currently have 6 Rest Rooms (4 unisex single person)
 - Currently have a small out-of-date kitchen
- Legacy:
 - Contemporary Floor Plan & Design
 - 1st Floor - 12 educational spaces & a possible (6 restrooms)
 - 2nd Floor – 6 educational spaces & 2 possible (1 weather permitting) (4 restrooms/2 Unisex)
 - The Banquet Center – Commercial Kitchen – Rooftop – Prayer Chapel - Gymnasium
 - 37,858 Square Feet With No Basement and No Flat Roof
 - Create Space for multiple events including family repast
 - Space for:
 - Workforce Development Programs
 - Economic Development
 - Youth Retention Programs & More

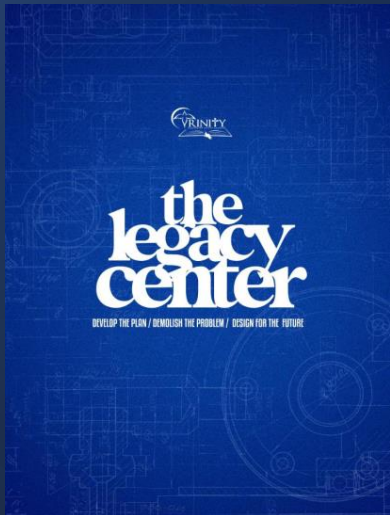

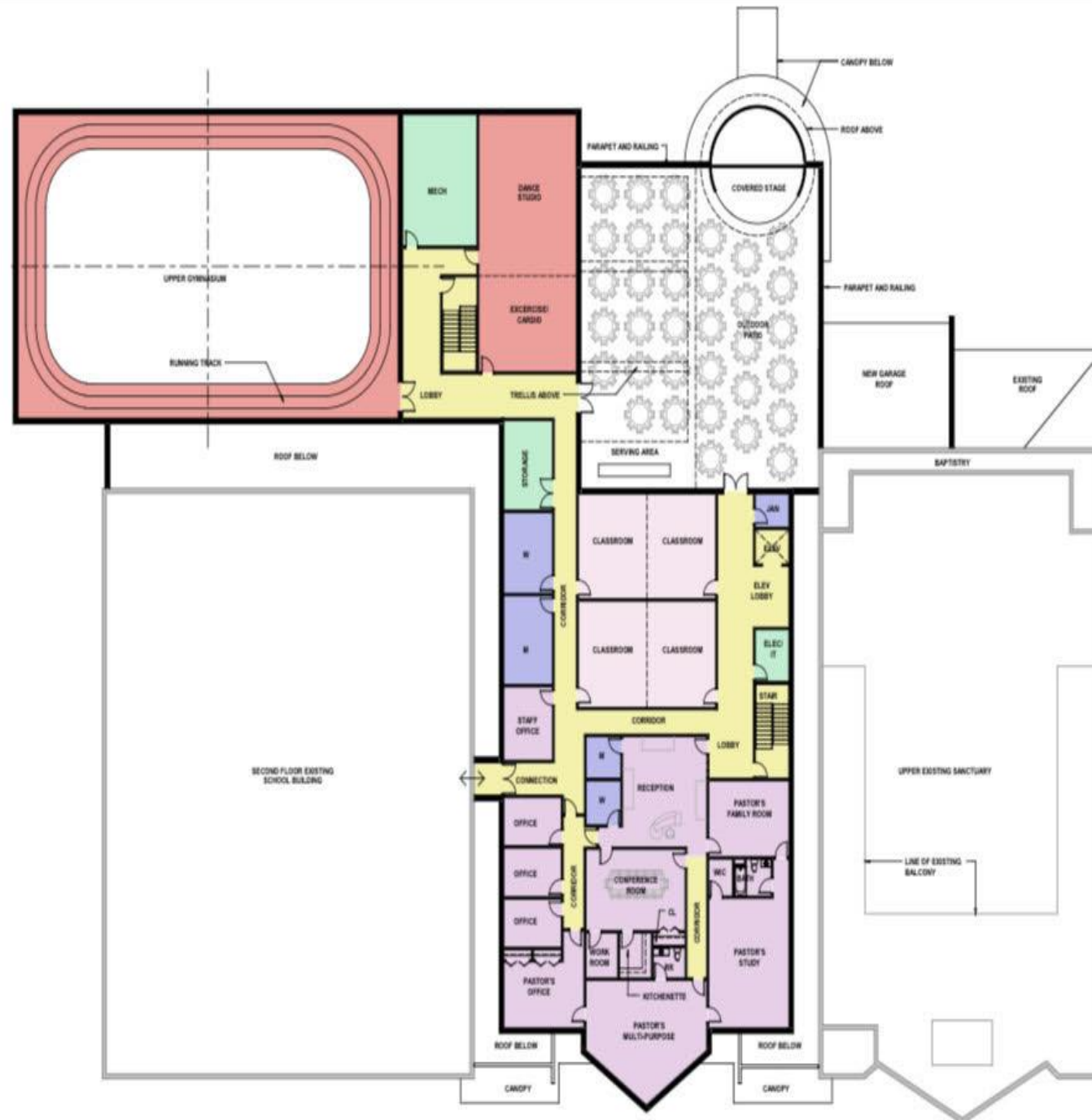

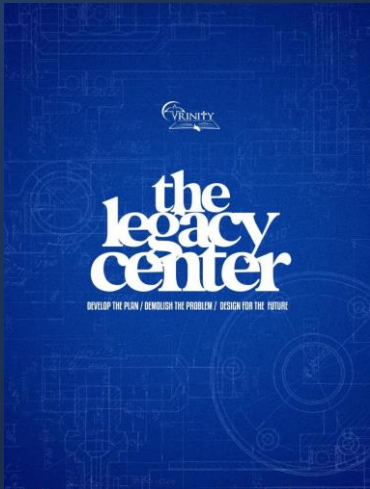
SCHEMATIC DESIGN

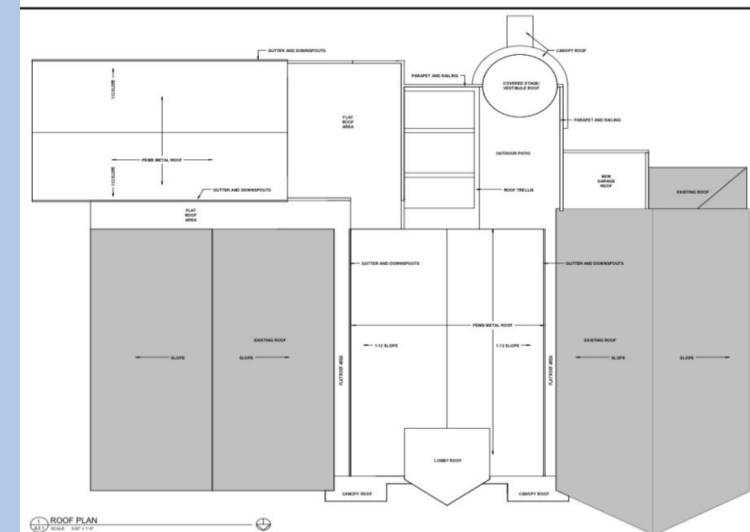
- Phase 1 – Begin Construction Site Preparation – May 2022

 - Removal of items that can be repurposed in the facility
 - Doors
 - Fixtures / Décor / Furniture
 - Plumbing

Construction Phase 2 – Ceremonial Ground-Breaking

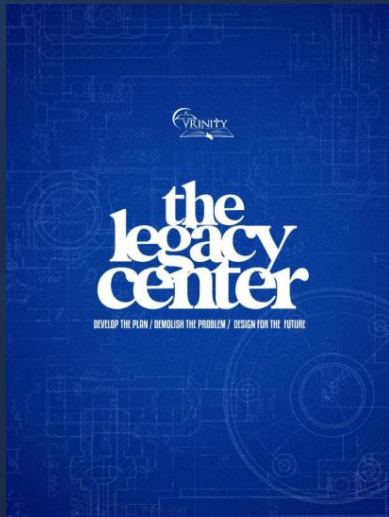
