‘Doses After Dark’ 32-Hour Marathon Vaccination Clinic Coming to Peel

In an effort to vaccinate more Peel residents living near the International Centre in Mississauga, the Region of Peel will be running ‘Doses After Dark,’ a 32-hour marathon vaccination clinic at the International Centre from 12:30 p.m. on Saturday, May 15, until 8:30 p.m. on Sunday, May 16. Starting May 11, all Peel residents 18 years of age or older will be able to book appointments through the Regional [website](#). This exciting event will be the first of its kind in Peel and will administer over 7,600 – the most vaccines administered at a single clinic since the start of our campaign.

Group 2 of People Who Cannot Work from Home & Adults 18+ with At-Risk Health Conditions

Effective May 11, [Group 2 of people who cannot work from home](#), and adults 18 years or older with [at-risk health conditions](#) will become eligible to book a vaccine appointment across the province.

Adults 40+ Across Ontario

Starting May 13, all adults 40 years or older living in Ontario will become eligible to book a vaccine appointment.

High-Risk Health Care Workers Eligible to Receive a Second Dose at Shortened Interval

The Ontario government is adding high-risk health care workers to the list of those eligible to receive their second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine earlier than the extended four-month interval. Eligibility for booking will begin by the end of the week of May 10. You can find a list of eligible health care workers on the [province’s website](#).
