

Jonathan Byrd and the Pickup Cowboys with Corin Raymond December 3 @ 7 PM

The Purple Onion is pleased to welcome <u>Jonathan Byrd</u> and the Pickup Cowboys with <u>Corin</u> Raymond, Sunday, December 3 at 7 PM.

Jonathan has performed at The Purple Onion many times. He is, a preacher's son, a Gulf War veteran, and an award-winning singer-songwriter from Chapel Hill, North Carolina who is best known for his narrative tales of love, life, and death in America. In 2003, he was among the winners of the New Folk competition at the Kerrville Folk Festival. He set a record for CD sales at the festival that year, making more sales than the main stage acts. His song, "The Ballad of Larry" has been listed a "Top Rated Song" by Americana-UK. He primarily performs solo and accompanies himself in a variety of traditional acoustic guitar styles. His recordings have featured a variety of instrumental ensembles and typically include one or more instrumental tracks that feature Byrd's skillful flatpicking technique.

Together, Jonathan Byrd and The Pickup Cowboy, Johnny Waken (quitar, mandolin, saw) are musical gunslingers, vaudevillian hucksters, and old-fashioned tent revivalists. Between heartbreaking ballads and hellraising sing-alongs, the Cowboys entertain and get audiences involved in the show. They are ioined on this tour by Canadian folk rocker Corin Raymond, a troubadour whose robust veracity appeals to older folks and children alike and Kyshona Armstrong, a 2017 NIMA nominee for Best R&B/Soul Artist, Best Live R&B/Soul Performer and Artist Of The Year on bass.





Holiday Safety Tip

When purchasing an artificial tree, look for the label "Fire Resistant." When purchasing a live tree, check for freshness. A fresh tree is green, needles are hard to pull from branches and when bent between your fingers, needles do not break. When setting up a tree at home, place it away from fireplaces, radiators or portable heaters. Place the tree out of the way of traffic and do not block doorways. Cut a few inches off the trunk of your tree to expose the fresh wood. This allows for better water absorption and will help to keep your tree from drying out and becoming a fire hazard. Be sure to keep the stand filled with water because heated rooms can dry live trees out rapidly. Make sure the base is steady so the tree won't tip over easily.

Barber Shop

When we were little we didn't get many haircuts in Saluda. If Mary Phifer came up to visit, she could cut it. But in life we all suddenly need things, and a hair cut is surely one of these.





Mr. Will Forrest was the barber in Saluda, and his shop was right next to where Thompson's Grocery Store is now. Will Forest had lost a leg in his lifetime, and he had what we called a peg-leg; a wooden thing that fitted on the leg at the knee, and had staves on it and a belt to hold everything together. Mr. Forrest was a nice man and he knew who we all were, and he gave haircuts that lasted a while.

He also kept up with the foot traffic on the side walk, and the main street car and carriage traffic. When a train went up or down he had to check on who was in the crew. He did his checking and observing by leaning away over on his good leg and balancing himself with his pegleg. That in itself is scary enough, but when you know that Will Forrest's Barber Shop had wooden floors, and he, like all

Saluda shop keepers, used to put kerosene oil or something on the shop floors to keep down the dust. This made it down right reckless!

You'd be sitting there getting a haircut and Mr. Forrest with the comb and scissors in hand 'a whackin' around your ears, and all of a sudden a train would come in view, and Mr. Forrest would lean way over with that peg-leg on that oily floor, with the scissors pointing at your eyes. It was a real excitement to have Mr. Forrest cut your hair. You were so glad it was over, it just made you feel good to pay up and git' on down the street.

For many years there was a man who came on Saturday and sat in front of Mr. Forrest's Barber Shop and played mournful gospel and mountain music on his guitar, laying across his knee and him 'a pickin' with a guitar pick in his right hand and sliding his little bar with his left. People came on Saturdays and stood by the hour and listened. I never knew his name, but I see him there most every time I walk past there now. Will Forrest lived on Louisiana Avenue, just past Bob Newman's house.

Will Forrest

W.S. Forrest was raised on a farm near Saluda. He opened a pool room and barber shop in Saluda in May, 1913 in the U.E. Staton Bldg. He was famous for his sense of humor, wooden leg, and expert barbering. (Courtesy of "Saluda 100 Years" book.)


