



Judging from the feedback received after the recent ninth annual NASWA Veterans Conference, this year's event was another success.

Approximately 500 people attended this year's conference, and 202 attendees completed a survey to let us know what they thought. This year's conference was the first held in person since 2019, after two years of virtual events.

A total of 132 attendees said their overall experience was excellent, and another 49 said it was above average. Ten called it average, but no one said they had a bad time. A wide variety of topics and sessions were winners – such as the keynote speakers – especially Master Sergeant Cedric King and General Stanley McChrystal - the USDOL pre-con session, the workshops, and the opportunity to network with their peers from across the US.

The majority of people in attendance were DVOPs and LVERs, and most attended a previous NASWA Vets Conference, either virtually or in person.

We learned a few things this year – like not having a keynote speaker over lunch, and that we need to rename/rework “pre-con” so more states will allow people to attend. We had a number of requests for topics and speakers that have been featured at previous conferences, so perhaps it is time to bring them back. Other suggestions focused on room size and space, food, air quality, length of conference (either too short or too long,) etc. Some liked the assigned seating, others did not. Planning is already underway for our 10th conference, August 2-4, 2023, at The Grand Hyatt in Washington DC.
