Recently Enacted Legislation Related to AI

State	Link	Summary
AR	Act 927 / HB 1876	Clarifies ownership of AI-generated content, including ownership by those who provide training data or employers when content is created as part of job duties. The law also prohibits infringement on existing copyright or intellectual property rights.
CT	SB5	Establishes a statewide AI framework covering governance, workforce development, education, AI developers and employment systems, innovation, research, and protections for consumers, workers, and the public.
MT	SB 212	Requires AI-controlled critical infrastructure deployers to develop risk management policies based on specified standards, including NIST's AI Risk Management Framework. It also prohibits government restrictions on private ownership or lawful use of computational resources unless necessary to serve a compelling government interest.
ND	HB 1429	Prohibits the use of AI-powered robots to stalk or harass individuals, expanding existing stalking and harassment laws.
NJ	AR 158 / SR 121	Urges generative AI companies to voluntarily provide whistleblower protections for employees.
NY	S 7599C	Requires state agencies to publicly disclose their automated decision-making tools. The law also protects state employees' collective bargaining rights and prohibits AI systems from causing job displacement or position loss.
OR	HB 2748 / Chapter 378	Prohibits non-human entities, including AI-powered agents, from using certain licensed and certified medical professional titles, such as registered nurse and certified medication aide.
